Achievement Report (High School)



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What is Achievement?

- Something accomplished, especially by superior ability, special effort, great courage, etc.
 - Receiving at least a 'C' for a class is an *achievement*.
 - Graduating from high school is an *achievement*.
 - Qualifying for the Alaska Performance Scholarship is an *achievement*.



Grades

- Grades of A, B, C, D, and F are based on course performance and yield 0 to 4 points (up to 5 points for Advanced Placement)
- The high school cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) ranges from 0 to 5 and weights each grade by the class credits
- Student transcripts contain the courses, grades for each course, cumulative GPA, and rank
- Test scores are not on transcripts



Grades

- All high school students have a cumulative GPA
- In 2023-24, over 80% of high school students achieved at least a 'C' GPA (2.0 or higher)
- In 2023-24, 76% of grade 9 students not proficient on Alaska STAR ELA* had GPAs of at least a 'C'
- GPA more predictive of graduation than proficiency on tests:
 - 4-year Graduation Rates for at least 'C' GPA student is 88.3% vs 19.8% for less than 'C' GPA (87% accuracy)

High School Graduation (4-year)

- Students graduate with a high school diploma with 22.5 credits typically within 4 years
- In 2023-2024, 80.7% 4-year high school graduation rate vs 77.7% in 2022-23
- 92.8% 4-year graduation rate for at least 'C' average or higher students with regular attendance




High School Graduation (5-year)

- 5-year graduation rate based on 4-year student cohort with 1 additional year to graduate
- In 2023-2024, 82.1% 5-year high school graduation rate vs 83.5% in 2022-23
- 95.5% 5-year graduation rate for at least 'C' average or higher students with regular attendance

- June 2024, governor Mike Dunleavy signs legislation to update the Alaska Performance Scholarship(APS):
 - Requirement to meet minimum GPA <u>OR</u> test score (not both)
 - Increased award amounts
 - Expanded qualifying curriculum options
 - Extended term from 6 to 8 years
 - Step-up provisions, and
 - Merge of collegiate/CTE award
- These changes also impacted the graduating class of 2024



- Alaska Performance Scholarship goals:
 - Improve students' high school performance
 - Encourage students to take more challenging courses
 - Prepare students for postsecondary education and career success

For the graduating class of 2024:

- 372 students qualified for new APS
- Over twice as many as previous year!
 56.1% vs 21.4%
- Over \$1.6 million possible funds annually



Summary

- Majority of students achieve at least a 'C' GPA
- 'C' GPA more predictive of high school graduation than proficient test scores
- Over 95% of students with at least a 'C' GPA in regular attendance graduate high school within 5 years
- Over half of 2024 graduates acquired Alaska Performance Scholarship



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
