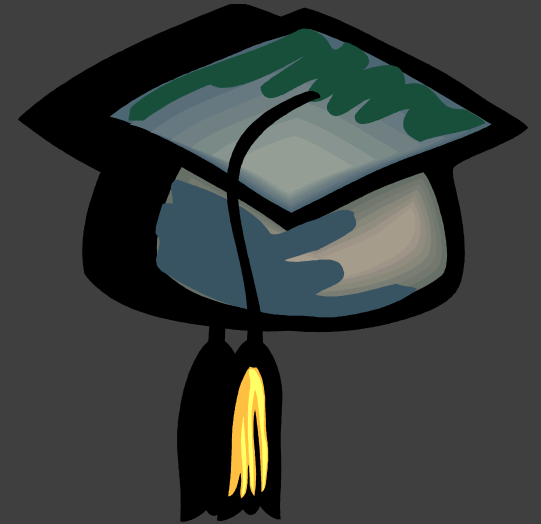
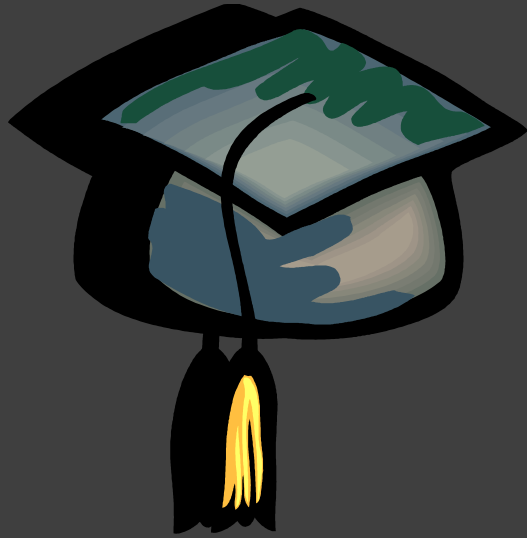

ACT®

- If you haven't taken college admissions tests yet...
 - Take BEFORE DECEMBER
- Is your school test optional?
- Register online
 - SAT
 - ACT
- When applying for college, you will have to send the scores *yourself* from the websites (counselors do not have that ability).
 - While registering, choose 4 colleges to have your scores sent to **FOR FREE.**
 - Athletes may send scores to NCAA at this time using one of their 4 free sends.

ACT®

- Always send your scores. Most colleges will “Superscore”.
 - Superscore – taking the best outcomes from each section each administration to present your best result
- Take the test more than once, if possible.
- Know your college application deadlines.
 - There can be a several week delay between sending them and the college receiving them.
- **Testing fee waivers** are available for students who meet criteria. Visit official websites for details or see your counselor.

Apply to More than 1 School

Go to the college website for the application

- **Stretch Schools** – most competitive schools to get in to. Probably your first and second choice schools, typically low admission rates.
- **Match Schools** – You're a good fit with your grades and test scores. Chances of admissions are good (not guaranteed), about half get in.
- **Safety Schools** – a sure bet, you know you can get in. Your back-up plan, most will be accepted.

You **must** finalize the application by sending in:

- Test scores
- Transcripts
- Essays (if applicable)
- Recommendations (if applicable)
- Other – it is *your* responsibility to find out what else!
 - Proof of residency



Once accepted, provide:

- Immunization records (Ga. Schools)
- Deposit
- Sign up for orientation
- Housing

Timeline Considerations

- Find out application deadlines!
- **Recommendation: apply before Thanksgiving**
 - For: scholarships, housing, etc.
- Set up a NEW and PROFESSIONAL e-mail address.
 - Begin checking email **regularly**
- You do **not** have to wait on test scores to submit applications
 - Keep in mind the possible **2 week** delay
- Transcripts on mypaymentsplus.com
 - **2 day** turnaround time for pick up
- Request **recommendation letters** from counselors and teachers. Be *courteous* and give at least **2 weeks** for completion! No last minute requests please 😊

- Directions are on the Seckinger website in the counseling section.
- Cost is \$5.00 per transcript – paper or electronic service (Common App/Naviance, SendEDU)
- Paper
 - Pick up sealed envelope in Counseling Canopy
- Common App/Naviance, SendEDU
 - Your counselor attaches your transcript to their portion of the electronic app. Your counselor may need additional information to complete their portion for you.

- Gates Scholarship

- The Gates Scholarship (TGS) is a highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for outstanding, minority, high school seniors from low-income households.
- Deadline: September 15

- QuestBridge Scholarship

- Are you a low-income high school senior who has excelled academically, but feels that the nation's best colleges are financially out of reach? The QuestBridge National College Match can be your pathway to a top college. Through this college and scholarship application process, you can apply for free to the nation's best colleges and be considered for early admission and a full four-year scholarship
- Deadline: September 27

How do I apply for the Zell?

Through completion of the

Award:

- 100% tuition to a GA public college
- About \$4000 to a GA private college

The HOPE Scholarship

Minimum 3.0 in only academic
GPA,

no testing component

How do I apply for the HOPE?

Through completion of the
FAFSA or via GAfutures.org

Award:

- up to 85%-90% tuition GA public college
- About \$3600 tuition GA private college

Hope award amounts are adjusted annually based on lottery revenue. Awards do not adjust upwards with tuition increases nor do they cover books or fees.

FAFSA

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

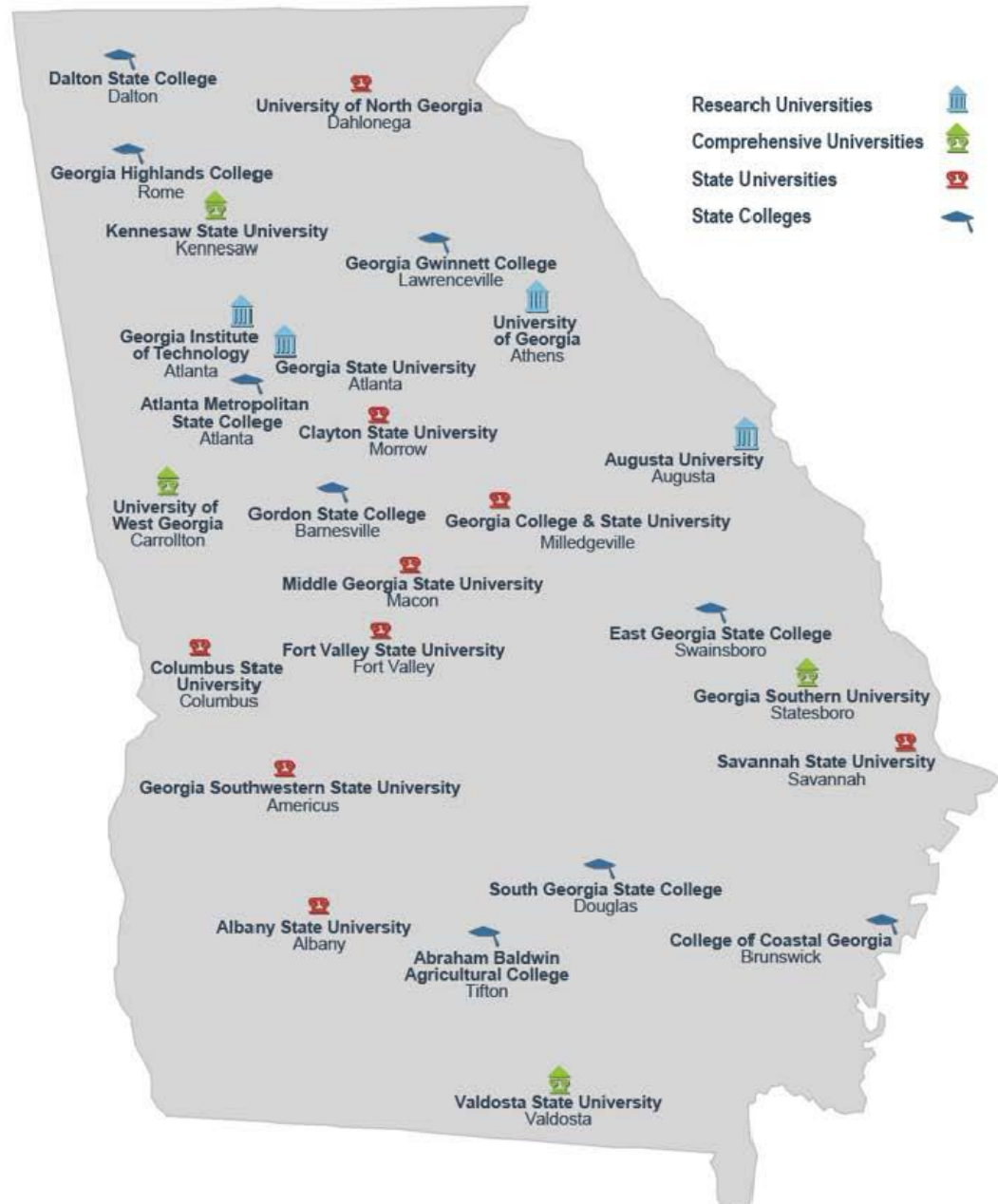


- Opens December 1
- Deadlines vary by college (usually in the spring)
- Do **not** have to fill out for admissions
- Will do four things:
 1. Automatically sign up for HOPE or Zell Miller Scholarship (if you qualify at end of the year)
 2. Determine if you qualify for Pell Grant (needs based, up to ~\$6,000, do not pay back)
 3. Determine if you qualify for work study (working on campus)
 4. Determine how much you qualify to borrow in federal student loans

- Minimum GPA 2.5 (academic classes only)
- Average GPA 3.44
- Minimum SAT 480 Reading, 440 Math
- Average SAT 1070
- Minimum ACT 17 Reading, 17 Math
- Admit Rate 88.9%
- Students who have a GPA of less than 3.2 should submit ACT or SAT scores along with their high school transcript to be considered for admission.

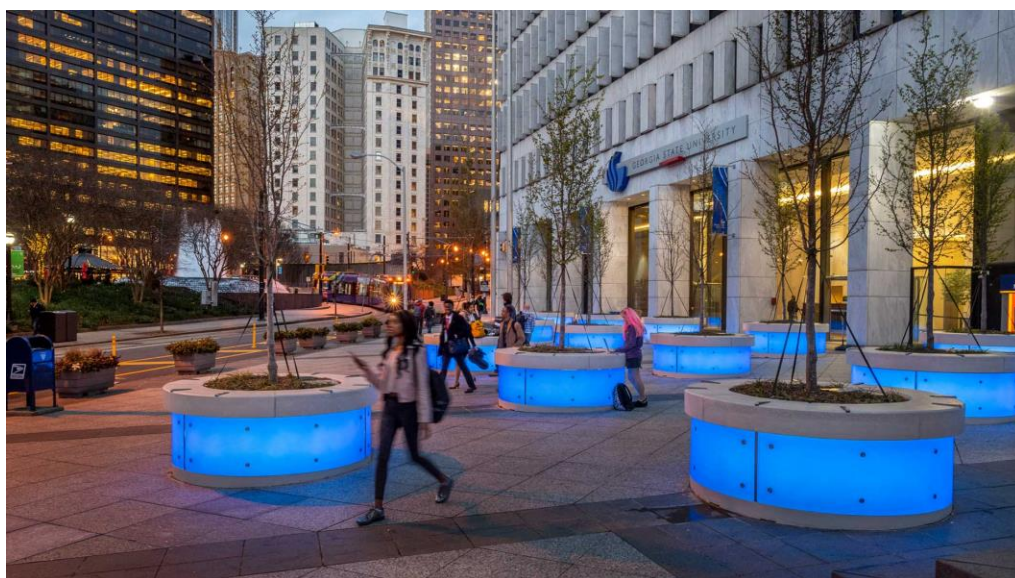

Submit Test Scores (Optional). Georgia State is test-optional through Summer 2025 for students whose high school GPA is 3.4 or higher.* If your high school GPA is below 3.4, you should submit test scores that meet either of the following criteria:

- SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score of at least 480 and SAT Math score of at least 440**

OR

- ACT English or Reading score of at least 17 and ACT Math score of at least 17**
