Using all End of Grade and End of Course test scores, school accountability growth is calculated using EVAAS, a value-added growth modeling tool. This indicator is significant since it is used in calculating the (A-F) school performance grades. The School Performance Grades are based on student achievement (80%) and growth (20%).
