APPROVAL OF A SERIES OF CHANGE ORDERS OF CHENAULT AGRICULTURE BARN

The Board unanimously approved a series of change orders to enhance the Chenault Agriculture Barn and its facilities. These changes include installing a high-quality sound system, upgrading the flooring, adding a functional countertop in the auctioneer booth, and expanding the barn's footprint at the back. The flooring upgrade will significantly improve the barn's aesthetic appeal and make it easier to maintain and clean. Given the anticipated heavy foot traffic during various events, this change will create a more durable and long-lasting environment.

The new sound system is vital for the barn's operations, allowing for better audio capabilities during events. This enhancement ensures that announcements can be heard clearly throughout the facility, creating a more enjoyable experience for all attendees.

Expanding the barn's livestock area will create more space and enhance the facilities for housing and caring for animals. This expansion demonstrates the district's commitment to supporting agricultural education and offering students valuable hands-on learning experiences in a safe and well-equipped environment.



Superintendent's Report

Our students' opportunities to show mastery of many skills are fantastic! Here are some of the strong performances in all aspects of our student experience since our last Board Meeting.

- Due to our students and the hard work of Mr. Buckman and the MCHS Key Club, over 15,000 non-perishable items were donated to the Sterling Community Food Coalition during the Key Club's annual food drive. Over the last 4 years they have successfully gathered and donated more than 55,000 items.

- MCHS Volleyball student athletes Alexis White, Sara Zink and Sophie Fouch were named to the All 10th Region Volleyball teams. Alexis was named 1st team All-region while Sara and Sophie were named 2nd team All-region.
- Ava Vanderhoof, Daniel McCarty, Ben Sapp, Katie Allison, Liam Bourne, and Maxx Sapp were selected to the 2025 KMEA Allstate Choir.

DISTRICT APPROVES

- The Kentucky Department of Education mandates the submission of a BG-1 form for all construction projects.
 The Board has confidently approved the initial BG-1 for the high school renovation project, effectively addressing the current facility plan needs and enabling the project to advance to the design phase.
- Due to ongoing issues, The Board approved replacing the bleachers at MSE.
- The Board has approved the purchase of three vehicles: one for student transportation, one for the police department, and one for maintenance.
- The technology department has recommended that the Board approve an upgrade of the video and audio equipment in the Clay Center ballrooms. This upgrade will include the installation of new projectors and a functional sound system, significantly enhancing the experience for all users and renters of the ballrooms. It will allow for easy sharing of presentations across one or all three screens and provide clear audio through built-in speakers, making it more effective for professional development training sessions and community events.
- The Board approved painting the interior of Northview Elementary.
