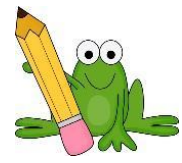

#### ECPS School Improvement Goals 2022-2023

**READING:** 80% of all first grade students will score at or above grade level on the first grade reading assessment (Oral Reading Fluency)

1st Grade Focus: Fluently read 47 or more words per minute.

**MATH:** 70% of all first grade students will meet or exceed projected growth on spring Math MAP.

1st Grade Focus: Adding/subtracting fluently within 10.

#### Jointly Developed

Parents and staff at ECPS developed this School-Parent Compact for Achievement through our Parent Advisory Committee.
