


Mass Communication

Here's a list of some common easy-to-guess passwords. These are often used by individuals but are highly insecure due to their simplicity and predictability:

Al Powered Phishing

Al Phishing scams are just the latest in the world of everemerging Cyber Threats. Al is being used to create more convincing and sophisticated scams aimed at tricking people into revealing sensitive information.

As many as 90% of all cyber crimes are tracked to originate from a phishing email. As a reminder:

- No one in the district will ask for money...no matter how real it sounds.
- NEVER give your password to a substitue, colleague or student
