
Second Semester in the Art Room...

<u>Attendance Matters</u>

Currently, Stratton is at an attendance rate of 93.13% for the 2024-2025 school year. As we end the first semester and ring in the New Year, we would like to offer some reminders for parents and students in order to maximize attendance and improve the learning experience.

- 1. Have predictable bedtime and morning routines to ensure a restful night's sleep and a structured start to the morning.
- 2. Be sure to practice good hygiene before and after school to minimize the presence of any classroom germs coming home or going to school.
- 3. Be sure to maintain communication with the classroom teachers via dojo, back n' forth folders, or through email.
- 4. Lastly, plan ahead. In the event of a weather delay ask family or friends to assist with school drop off to ensure your child maintains attendance.

<u>Kiss & Go Lane</u>

The Kiss and Go Lane
 is a pull-through only. Pull to the right lane as far up as you can to drop off or pick up students.
 Please do so safely and quickly.
 DO NOT PARK OR EXIT YOUR
 VEHICLES. The left lane is used for exiting the Kiss and Go area.
 DO NOT let students out or pick up while in the left lane.

<u>Employee Parking</u> <u>Area</u>
