### Fifth Grade Flash...



December flew by in a whirlwind of holiday festivities, school spirit, and a wonderful mix of learning and laughter! A major highlight of the month was the muchanticipated Gingerbread House Decorating event. Students had a blast designing and constructing their own gingerbread houses using colorful candies, frosting, and edible decorations. It was the perfect blend of teamwork, creativity, and holiday spirit, with each house showcasing the effort and imagination of our talented fifth graders. Additionally, students embraced holiday-themed writing activities, crafting stories about magical winter adventures, and festive traditions.

In ELA, our fifth graders took a break from HMH to dive into the beautifully written novel, *Esperanza Rising*. In *Esperanza Rising*, students will explore the themes of resilience, hope, and personal growth through the story of Esperanza Ortega, a young girl who faces immense challenges after a tragedy changes her life. As they read, students will analyze how Esperanza transforms from a life of privilege to one of hardship, learning valuable lessons about overcoming adversity, the importance of family, and adapting to new circumstances. The novel also provides an opportunity to discuss cultural heritage, empathy, and the significance of community in difficult times.



In math, students successfully completed Module 2, mastering multiplication and division of multidigit numbers. They are now excited to begin learning how to add and subtract fractions, a skill that will further develop their understanding of number relationships and expand their mathematical abilities.

In addition this month, students explored the states of matter, studying solids, liquids, and gases through hands-on experiments and engaging activities. They investigated how matter changes states and the role temperature plays in these transformations. They also learned about early civilizations, exploring the rise of ancient cultures and their lasting contributions to modern society.

As we move into the new year, we are excited about the many more adventures and projects awaiting our fifth graders. Thank you for your continued support and for being a part of our wonderful classroom community.

## Third Grade Thoughts ...

Happy New Year! We hope everyone had a healthy and joyful holiday season. Our students have returned to school refreshed and ready to dive back into learning!



In Math, we are excited to begin our pilot program, *Eureka Math*<sup>2</sup>, starting with Module 3. This unit focuses on exploring multiplication and division through units of 10. We will revisit the commutative property from Module 1 and dive deeper into the distributive and associative properties. As with many mathematical concepts, building a strong foundation is essential for future success. We encourage all students to practice their multiplication facts at home to strengthen their skills!

In Science, we are wrapping up our weather unit. Students have been learning about weather patterns, the water cycle, and tools used to measure rain. Hopeful-

ly, we'll have a chance to put our weather knowledge to the test with some snow this month!

Our students are working hard every day, and we couldn't be more proud of their efforts. Thank you for your continued support, and have a fantastic month ahead!

### Fourth Grade Focus...

Welcome back to the new year fourth grade! During our holiday season, fourth graders at LADSBS participated in a "Deck the Halls" activity. The students listened to Stevie Wonders song, "Someday at Christmas", as a motivation to think about the holiday season as more than just an exchange of store bought gifts. We discussed gifts that could make the world a better place. The students considered non materialistic items they could share with others. Some ideas they thought of were: food, security, hope, creativity, warmth, concern, and smiles. Each child wrote about their "Gift to the World" on a Holiday light bulb. During the month of January, our fourth grade classes will continue our science unit, "Powering the Fair" to learn all about energy. For the first month of the new year, our students will move on to fractions in math. As always, students will also be working to improve problem solving skills.

In Social Studies, we will begin this year studying the Native American People of New York and how they have influenced the people, government, and the society of our state.
