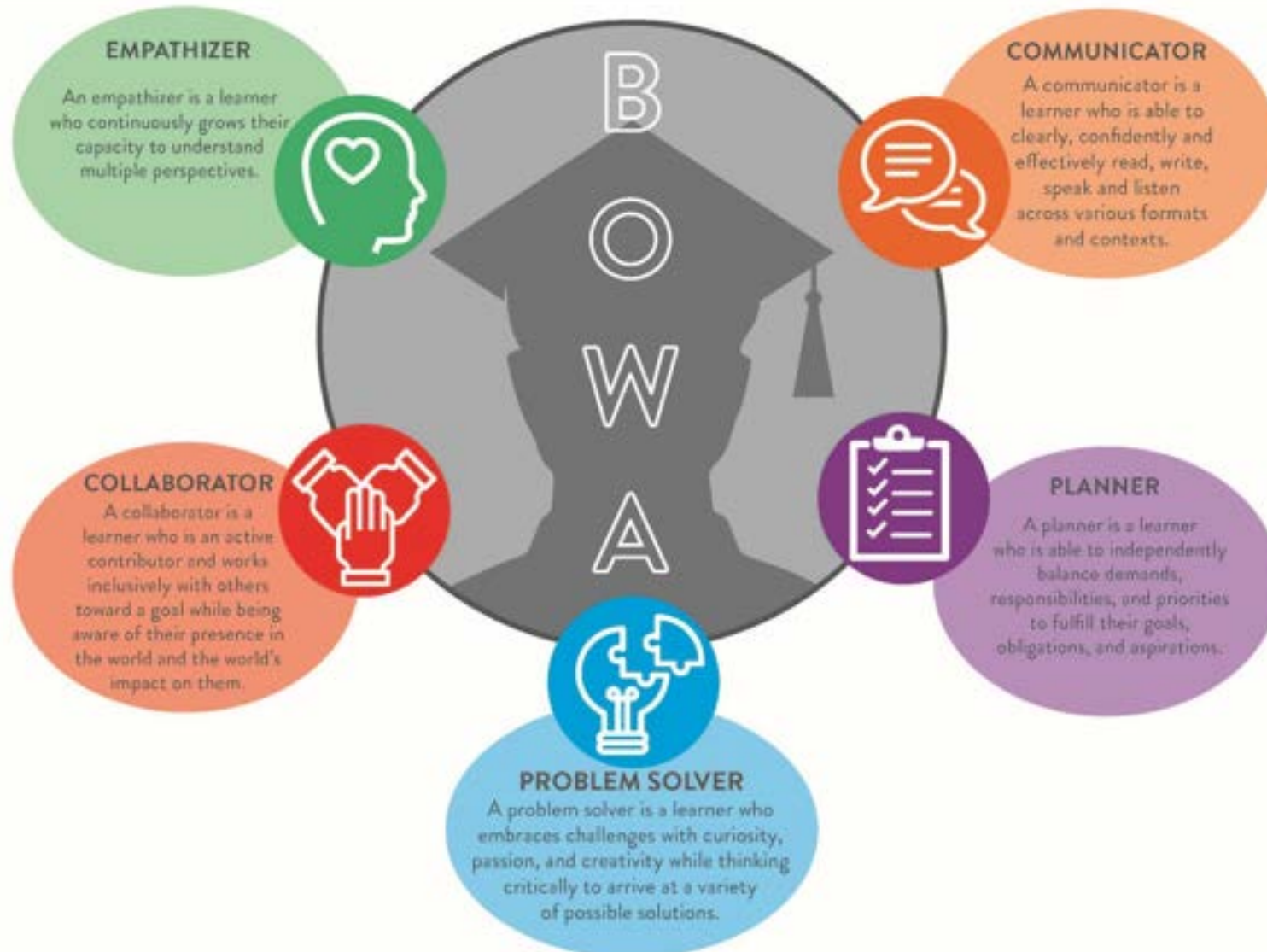

- Current 2021-2022 Amity Surplus - \$865,155
- Possible Designated 1% to CNR - \$516,981
- Capital Projects Identified for CNR Funds
 - New Musical Instruments – Middle Schools
 - Roof Drainage & Gutters – Middle Schools
 - Media Center Updates – Middle Schools
- Amount Currently Identified to be Returned to the Towns - \$348,174 (0.7%)
 - At this time, the State of Connecticut **has not** provided the final allocation of excess cost to any district in Connecticut.
 - Open Purchase orders through August - insurance, OOD special education
