Health & Wellness

Important Medical Update for Grades PreK and 6th

For PreK: The law requires that every child 6 months through 5 years of age who attends any childcare center or school facility must annually receive at least one dose of the influenza vaccine between Sept. 1st and Dec 31st. If your child is 3-5 years old and in PreK on or after September 1st, he/she must receive at least one dose of the flu vaccine this fall. Please, contact your physician as soon as possible to schedule an appointment. Free flu vaccines are also offered at your local City Health Department.

Once your child has received the flu vaccine, please forward the documentation from their physician or health department indicating the date it was given, so your child's health record may be updated. If your child does not receive the state-required vaccine and does not have a letter of medical or religious exemption, they will not be permitted to return to school on January 6th when school resumes after the winter break.

Children born on or after 1/1/1997 and entering or attending 6th grade must have received one dose of Tdap given on or after their 10th birthday and one dose of a meningococcal-containing vaccine. NOTE: This applies to students who turn 11 years old and attend grade six.

Please contact your child's physician or clinic for an appointment or copy of these updated records to comply with these requirements. Please bring copies of your child's updated immunization records to the school nurse or email them.

<u>If your child does not receive the state-required vaccine and does not have a letter of medical or religious exemption, they will not be permitted to return to school on January 6th when school resumes after the winter break.</u>
