Over the winter break, students were offered an opportunity to complete the Math and Reading Bingo Challenge. We hope they enjoyed the tasks. The students who completed these tasks will be recognized during the morning announcements and given a certificate and prize.

All students recently took their mid-year math assessment. They will take this assessment again at the end of the year. Certificates will be given to those students who showed at least 50% growth and/or showed a lot of effort while taking this assessment in December. We want to recognize all of our hard working students!

During the month of January, your child will also take a short reading assessment to determine how much growth has been made. After this assessment, teachers will be working with their students to set new reading goals. Parent letters will be sent home before the end of January showing your child's results. The letter will also include different activities that can be done at home to reinforce and strengthen skills. If you ever have any questions or concerns, feel free to make an appointment with your child's teacher. Mrs. Pronovost, the Reading Teacher, and Mrs. Ellington, the Literacy Facilitator, are also available. They are always glad to meet with you to discuss your child's progress.

As a reminder, your child can utilize the Math i-Ready computer programs at home if you have a device. Please encourage your child to read each night as well.



KINDERGARTEN GRADE MISS KRUIJS & MISS HALL

Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful winter break. As we return to school, we will be reinforcing the classroom routines and expectations from the beginning of the year.

Before the winter break, students completed their MOY Math iReady assessments which helps us to see students' math progress so far this year and to guide our math instruction. We will be working on Lesson 14: Comparing Shapes in math, where we will talk about the different attributes of shapes. Our Benchmark Unit 4 is all about understanding why writers tell many stories. We are excited to continue working with students on their decoding, high frequency word recognition, comprehension, and writing!

Please continue to have your child work on and return their homework packets each week and review their ECRI sheets every night. Staying consistent with these routines is crucial to your child's learning both at home and at school! We hope you all enjoyed reading *Henry and Mudge* with your child these past few weeks; more information will be coming soon about our next home book!

Happy New Year! We hope that everyone enjoyed the holidays. This month we will be doing the MOY reading tests to see the progress your child has made in reading at this point in the year. You can expect a letter to be sent home in February with the results.

Before the winter break, students completed their MOY math i-ready diagnostic. We will use the results to create their math goals for the rest of the year. This month we will learn new strategies to subtract and more about teen numbers.

In Science, we have begun Unit 2, learning about the sun, moon, and stars. In Phonics, we will continue reading and writing words with three-letter blends. We will continue sending home spelling lists and have spelling tests every Friday. We will finish Unit 3 of Benchmark this month and move onto Unit 5 learning about how technology can make a difference in our lives. The end of the 2nd marking period is coming up as well! As always, if you have any questions or concerns please reach out through ParentSquare or call the main office.



Welcome back and Happy New Year! We will be working on setting our mid-year goals for reading and math. Our students have just taken the middle of year Math i-Ready diagnostic assessment and will be soon taking the middle of year mCLASS Assessment. Students should be reading 78 words per minute to be considered on-grade level. We can't wait to see the progress the students have made! In ECRI, the students will learn new trick words, affixes, spelling words and contractions. In Math, we are working on adding and subtracting three-digit numbers solving two-step word problems. In Benchmark Unit 4, we are learning how stories can change based on who tells them. In Science, we are learning about how wind and water can change the shape of land.

Happy New Year! We hope the break was relaxing and rejuvenating. As we enter January we will be looking at our goals for the next few months.

In Reading, students will be taking their mid-year benchmark test. Students should be reading 105 words per minute to be considered on-grade level. We will also be continuing our open-ended questions each week as well as practicing our fluency.

In Math, our students will continue learning about multiplication and division. Please continue to have your child practice skip-counting to learn the multiples of each factor. By now each child should know the multiples of 2, 3, 4, 5, and 10. We will be working on 6, 7, 8, and 9 over the next several weeks. During the week before the winter break in December, our students took the mid-year Math i-Ready Diagnostic. We will use the results to set goals for the second half of the school year.

In ELA, students are learning about understanding the point of view of others. They are also focusing on writing a new fictional scene.


In Math, we are completing a unit on measurement and conversions. As always, please make sure your children are practicing their basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts.

In Science, we're exploring the fascinating topic of systems in space. We've just finished learning about adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. This can be tricky, but our students did an excellent job practicing these skills. We will continue to build on this knowledge as we move forward with new math concepts.

Friendly Reminders:

- Dress Warmly: Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the colder weather. Outdoor recess will continue unless the temperature is extremely low.
- Check Homework: Just a reminder that homework packets are distributed on Mondays and are due by Friday. These
 packets contain practice for the week and are an important part of reinforcing what we're learning in class.
 Encourage your child to stay on top of their homework packets each week. This helps reinforce skills and prepares
 them for the upcoming lessons.

MRS. PRONOVOST READING INTERVENTIONIST

In January we will be taking our middle of the year (MOY) mCLASS Assessments. The testing window is set for Jan 8th-14th. Home Connect reports will be sent home the first week of February so you can view your child's progress. Students will work with their teachers to look at the MOY information and discuss their progress towards their end of year reading goals. We will also look at this information to regroup students in both small groups and intervention. We cannot wait to see the gains your child has made towards reaching their goals.

Students seeing Mrs. Pronovost are asked to read at least 10 minutes each night. Please take time to read with your child at home.

Kindergarten families, be sure to help your child practice his/her letter and sound identification and play sound blending games with your child. The more you do at home, the better readers they will be.



Based on research, children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are less likely to read on grade level by the third grade. For older students, being chronically absent is strongly associated with low grades and students are more likely to drop out of high school. When students are consistently absent from school, not only do they run the risk of falling behind their peers academically, but they also exhibit poor self-esteem. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns. Regan School staff is willing to work together with you to help get your child to school daily and on time.
