Any child in Utah who is blind or has low vision is invited to join the Utah Goalball Team. Boy or girl teens can join the Utah team. Both teens and children (12 and younger) can participate in the tournament in April. The practices are held across the state. Whether your student attends a Utah School for the Blind campus, participates in the USB Outreach Program, or other programs in any district, they are invited to participate. The teams compete using a special ball that makes sound when moving. Each player is blindfolded wearing blacked out goggles. So, whether you are fully or partially blind, everyone is equal.

The state tournament will be held April 28 from 8:30-3:30 at Copperview Community Center. This event provides students with a fun opportunity to see their friends from across the state. We are also offering practices across the state. More Info from USDB's Kari Fredrickson.

Oceanology












Girls and Boys Basketball Season Ends






