
### Head Lice Information

Around this time of year we receive questions about head lice. In accordance with the most recent heath guidance from the <u>American</u> <u>Academy of Pediatrics</u>, the <u>OSD Head Lice Policy</u>, does not require students with head lice to stay home from school because lice is neither a health hazard nor sign of poor hygiene. I hope this newsletter finds you well and enjoying the new year!



# NKE Rotations Updates

## Music

- All music students will be working on TIMBRE (different instrument sounds) with the Instrument Wall, listening for classroom instruments and identifying them by sound only.
- In music class, 3rd and 4th graders are continuing to compose and play their own music (using treble clef staff and keyboard instruments, some adding chords!) They have also been singing rounds and canons (Ask to hear Ram Sam Sam or Black Socks)
- 2nd graders will be exploring Peter and the Wolf and reviewing DYNAMICS and TEMPO. Ask to hear the Wolf Game song!
- 1st graders and Kindergarteners are singing, moving, playing and listening for TEMPO (speed) and DYNAMICS (volume). Ask to hear the Grizzly Bear song!
- Kinder is also prepping for the Kindergarten Winter Sing!

### World Language

- Kindergarteners are continuing to grow stronger in sharing their interests in Spanish. We are exploring how other children play around the world.
- In 1st grade, we are learning about all kinds of pets - in Spanish and American Sign Language too!
- 2nd and 4th graders are learning about the parts of the body and some healthy habits!
- 3rd graders are learning how to talk about themselves. Soon we will share different personality traits
