

FIELD TRIPS

Students in the Governor Wentworth Regional School District learn in a variety of ways. One of the ways in which students learn is by going on field trips outside of their classroom and school building. The main purposes of field trips include:

1. Allowing students to experience part of their academic curriculum in ways that are not only written/oral.
2. Emphasizing certain parts of the basic curriculum.
3. Enriching the basic curriculum with cultural, scientific, or creative/imaginative experiences.
4. Building strong and effective relationships between students themselves, so that teaching and learning can take place.

Permission slips must be signed by a parent/guardian prior to any student leaving school grounds. All field trips must be approved by the building principal. The principal or designee will approve all chaperones and ensure adequate supervision. For overnight trips including both male and female students, there will be a minimum of one chaperone of each gender. Any overnight or out-of-state field trips must have the approval of the Superintendent.
