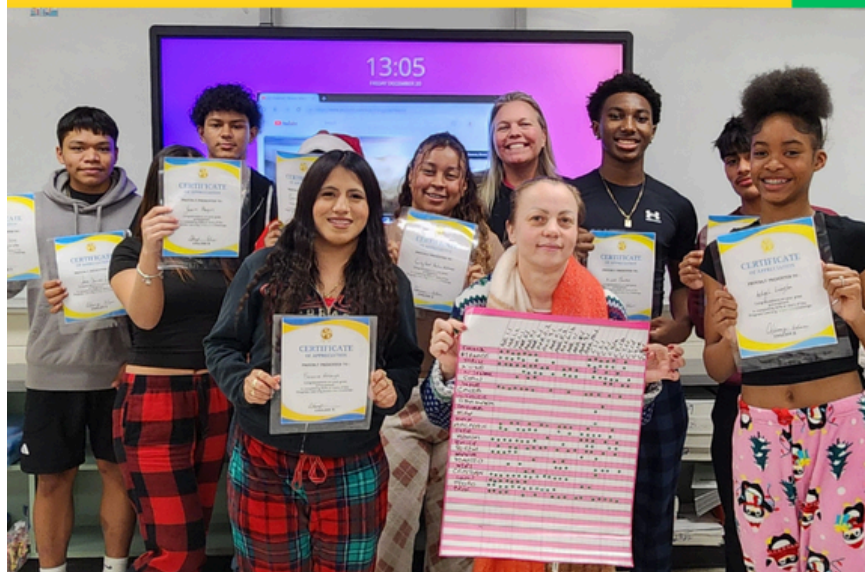

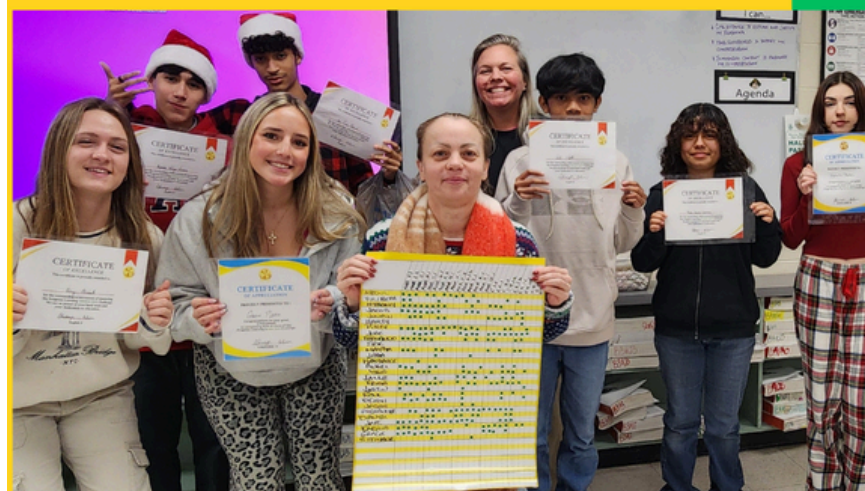

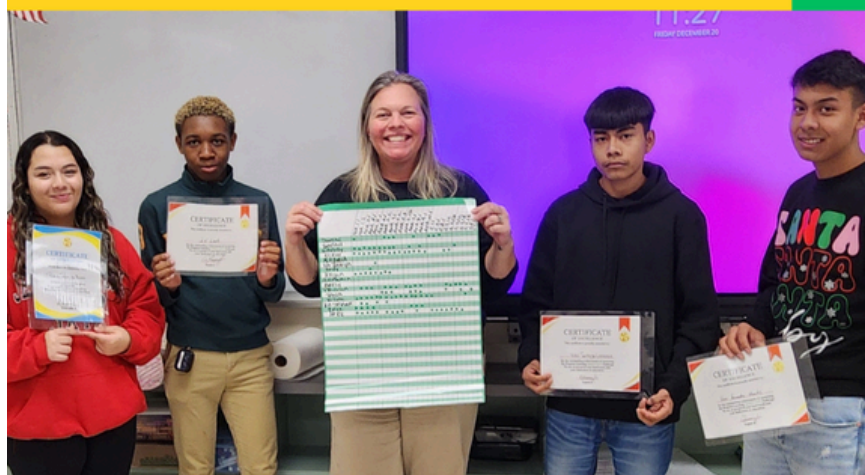

# ***Cell Phone Policy***

Horry County Schools previously shared a draft of the new HCS Personal Electronic Device Policy. The Board of Education has approved that policy, which will go into effect on January 22, the first day of the second semester.

We're excited that this policy will leave HCS students free to focus on engaging in meaningful interactions, collaborating with peers, and cultivating the college- and career-ready skills outlined in the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. Additional data may be found on the [Horry County Schools website](#).

Students who attend an HCS High School or Program School (AAST and ATA) may not have personal electronic devices or accessories visible or powered on during the school day or while they are on the school campus. The school day is defined as when students enter the school building and ending when the dismissal bell sounds. These devices include cell phones and all other personal electronic devices and accessories including, but not limited to, air pods, smart watches, tablets, wireless earbuds, handheld gaming devices, etc. These devices **MUST** be stored in the student's clear bookbag and must be powered off once students enter the building and remain off and out of sight until the end of the school day. Schools are not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices.

Limited exceptions may be applicable as specified by the high school's administration. Students at Myrtle Beach High School WILL still be permitted to utilize their cell phones in the cafeteria during lunch; this is the only time and location cell phones may be used during the school day and this continued allowance is subject to administration's discretion.

For every cell phone/electronic device violation, the following will apply:

- Parents/guardians will be contacted.
- When confiscated, cell phones/electronic devices will be stored in a secure location until the parent is able to retrieve it.
- A parent/guardian must pick up the cell phone/electronic device from the front

Disciplinary consequences:

- 1st violation: Warning
- 2nd violation: 1 day ISS
- 3rd violation: 2 days ISS
- 4th violation: 1 day OSS
- 5th violation: 3 days OSS
- 6th violation: 5 days OSS
- 7th: Evidentiary hearing

If a student refuses to give up their cell phone or electronic device, the student will receive a referral for (270) Refusal to Obey and the following consequences will apply:

- 1st violation: 1 day OSS
- 2nd violation: 1- 3 days OSS
- 3rd violation: 3 - 5 days OSS
- 4th violation: Evidentiary hearing

# Attendance Policy & Reminders

## Highlights: Failures due to Attendance

South Carolina State Policy: Please be reminded that high school students earn Carnegie units towards their high school diploma and must meet the required seat time guidelines as set by the state of South Carolina. Failure due to attendance or FA's will be counted each semester of the 24-25 school year. If you have questions about your attendance please see your grade level administrator.



### Failure due to Attendance Guidelines

#### Semester Course:

- Any Student over 5 unexcused absences (UNEX, UEPN) per class at the end of semester will fail due to attendance.

#### Quarter Classes: Gov't/Econ

- Any student over 3 unexcused absences (UNEX, UEPN) per class at the end of each quarter will fail due to attendance

**An FA does result in a student not receiving credit and re-taking the course, the FA does supersede any passing grade.**



### Attendance Recovery

- Students may stay after school **Tuesday-Thursday from 3:30-4:30** to make up attendance
- Students will need to make sure to let the teacher know they are staying for attendance recovery
- Students will need to make sure they have a ride home, transportation is not provided





# HCS Let's Make It CLEAR

**A NEW DISTRICTWIDE PROTOCOL FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR.**

HCS has implemented new safety and security tools for the upcoming 2024-25 school year this fall, and here's what you'll need to know.

## Clear Backpacks

### WHAT

All students must carry clear backpacks if they carry a backpack to school. Students may carry a small, non-clear pouch in their backpack to hold personal items, such as cellphones, money, and hygiene products.

### WHY

Clear backpacks provide another tool to ensure our highest priority, which is the safety and security of all members of the HCS community. Many large organizations, including the NFL, collegiate stadiums, and large-scale event venues, have implemented similar clear bag policies.



## Security Screening

### WHAT

HCS has phased in screening devices in all schools for the 2024-25 school year. All individuals will be required to pass through screening devices when entering the building.

### WHY

Screening devices increase the safety of students, staff, and visitors by reducing opportunities for prohibited items to enter the building.

## MBHS Tardy Policy

Tardies are assigned block by block.

Searches will be conducted every morning beginning at 7:45 a.m. Searches will not be considered as an excuse for being tardy to class.

Students who arrive tardy after 8:20 a.m. with an outside food/beverage purchased from a restaurant, cafe, etc. such as Starbucks or McDonalds, will have it confiscated. It may be picked up by the parent.

## Policies & Procedures per MBHS and SC State Law

### CELL PHONES AND EARBUDS

During the instructional school day, cell phones, earbuds and similar electronic devices will remain silent and out-of-sight. This includes; inside classrooms and in hallways during class and class changes. Students may use these devices during lunch break in the cafeteria.

To ensure safety, students are not permitted to walk around campus with:

- Cell phones out and actively talking on the phone
- Cell phone out and texting on the cell phones
- Earbuds in their ears
- Audio and video recording is not permitted and subject to suspension.

## OBSCENITY & PROFANITY POLICY

Obscene materials including, but not limited to illustrations (drawings, paintings, photographs, etc.) and oral, auditory, or written materials (books, letters, poems, videos, music, etc.) which are commercially or student produced are prohibited during school and at school sponsored activities. Students must choose their words carefully and consciously. Students using obscenities or profanities will be subject to OSS.

Consequences of using profanity are included in the chart below. However, if profanity is directed toward a staff member, the first offense will be a minimum of 3 days OSS or up to a recommendation of an evidentiary hearing.

**Consequences Every Offense:** If a student chooses not to follow the dress code requirements, he/she will be asked to call home for a change of clothes. The student will not be allowed to return to class until the situation has been corrected. The student will remain in ISS until a change of clothes has arrived.

## Hall Pass Policy

Any student who leaves a classroom during instructional time must have a hall pass from the teacher.

Only one student is permitted to leave the classroom at one time.

Students are not permitted to leave the classroom to go to the restroom during the first or last fifteen minutes of class. Teacher discretion is advised in the event of an emergency and contact with the parent should be made.

Excessive requests to use the restroom will be referred to administration for parent contact to confirm any extenuating circumstances.



## MBHS STUDENT DRESS CODE 2024-2025

Student dress should be confined to clothes that are reasonable, practical, and in good taste for school. School attire should reflect good taste, cleanliness, and comfort.

The school will make judgments and decisions as needed to preserve the health, safety, and decorum of students. Student cooperation is expected in the following areas:

- All students are required to wear appropriate footwear for school (no slippers).
- All shirts and tops must cover the midriff at all times. The following are examples of clothing that is unacceptable: tank tops with straps thinner than 2 inches, strapless, spaghetti straps, off-the-shoulder, cut-out designs, low-cut shirts, bare-back, fishnet stockings, sheer or mesh clothing that does not have an appropriate blouse or shirt underneath, etc. No pajama pants are allowed. (Students will be required to change clothes.)
- If students wear leggings, the bottom of the student's shirt must cover the student's midriff while in leggings, and the bottom of the shirt should not show the midriff if a student raises their arms.
- All pants and shorts must fit at the waist. No sagging or low riding pants or shorts will be permitted. Clothing must cover undergarments when sitting, standing, or bending.
- Hemlines and slits on dresses, skirts, and shorts (including bike shorts) above mid-thigh are not acceptable. Length cannot be shorter than the tip of the fingers when arms are placed straight at the sides of the body.
- Pants may not have holes that are visible above the tip of the fingers when arms are placed straight at the sides of the body. Leggings, or form fitting pants must be worn with a shirt that covers the student's hips.
- Head wear (including scarves, bandanas, bonnets, durags, or other head dressings) may not be brought on to campus, unless approved by the principal.
- Bandanas of any kind and color are prohibited.
- Hoods from sweatshirts or jackets may not be worn in the building for any reason.
- Face paint is not permissible.
- Clothing or jewelry that depicts any "gang style" writing; illegal activity; sexually related or obscene gestures and material; tobacco; drugs; alcohol; or words, pictures, or phrases that depicts violence or intimidation may not be worn.
- Any clothing or styles of dress that may be construed to provoke fear, violence, or intimidation, including gang related attire, is not acceptable.

**Consequences Every Offense:** If a student chooses not to follow the dress code requirements, he/she will be asked to call home for a change of clothes. The student will not be allowed to return to class until the situation has been corrected. The student will remain in ISS until a change of clothes has arrived.
