HFCA established a Strategic Plan in 2020 with four primary "pathways" to organize our priorities: Family, Maintenance and Modernization, Learning and Nurturing Environment, and Enriching Experiences. Over the past three years, we have added numerous programs and special projects in these four areas and will highlight our progress in our monthly newsletters. We will update our strategic plan after our goals are solidified as part of our accreditation process in February 2025.



Recent Initiative: Awakening Wisdom Workshop for Grades 4 - 8

Students in grades 4-8 recently participated in a workshop with a facilitator from Awakening Wisdom, a transformative school culture solution that emphasizes joy and humanity through teaching and learning. This workshop began with the assumption that trusting relationships are the foundation for any effective organization, school, or classroom. With more trust, students are unafraid to make mistakes, raise their hands, and participate fully. Each homeroom created its own Trust Agreements at the beginning of the year, and an October survey found about 50% of students thought they were working well, while 50% said they could improve. Therefore, the focus of the Awakening Wisdom workshop posed the following questions: How can we create a more trusting classroom, and what actions can students take to support an environment where everyone feels emotionally safe?

Students participated in this two-day workshop via Zoom, which included group discussions, relevant videos, breakout sessions, and individual activities.
