



What is Young Scholars Institute?

Eligibility: Young Scholars is open to students who have completed 1st-8th grades. Students are placed in classes with similar age bands (ex. 1st-4th, 3rd-5th, 4th-6th, 5th-8th).

DATES: June 2-6 & June 9-13 (Students may attend one or both weeks).

TIME: Young Scholars classes are from 8:15-2:45 (doors open at 8:00).

LUNCH: Information about lunch will be included with your class schedule.

PLACE: Freedom Middle School, 1000 Excellence Way, Franklin, TN.

FEES:

1. A \$30.00 non-refundable registration fee (Registration fee is not included in Tuition).
2. Tuition is \$225 per week and is due before May 20, 2025. NOTE: If paid after May 20, there will be a \$15 late fee.
3. Registration will be based on date application is submitted online AND the \$30.00 registration fee is paid.
4. Certain classes may require an additional fee which will be noted in the class description, please do not pay class fees until schedules have been finalized.

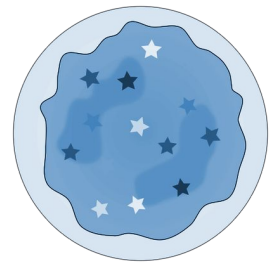

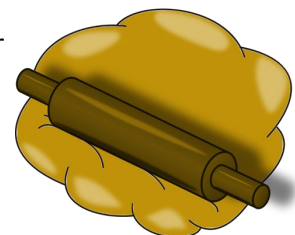

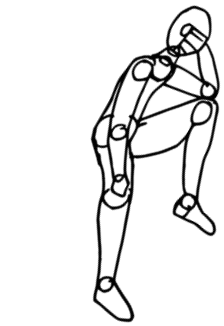
Arts and Crafts

ADVANCED CHESS - Take your Chess to the next level with advanced Chess moves, tactics, openings and strategies.



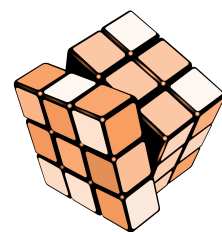



Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Is Young Scholars Institute right for my child?

A. Young Scholars Institute offers challenging exploratory classes which are designed for independent and highly motivated learners. The learning environment is ideal for students who are able to remain focused in less structured settings. YSI is for the mature, independent student who is ready to change classes.

Q. What are the rules for Young Scholars Institute?

A. All students are expected to follow directions, be respectful of teachers and peers, and adhere to classroom expectations. Failure to do so will result in the following:

1. Verbal warning by the YSI teacher.
2. With the second teacher warning, the student behavior is discussed with the Director of YSI and a call to the parents.
3. The third time, the student is removed from class and parents are called to pick up their child. The student will not be allowed to return that week and there is no refund. If the student is registered for the second week, the director and parents will discuss attendance for the second week.

Q. Will older students be grouped with younger students?

A. No. Classes will be offered to grade bands—those who have finished 1st-4th, 3rd-5th, 4th-6th, 5th-8th.

Q. Will lunch be served at YSI?

A. Yes, we will serve lunch at YSI. More information about lunch will be sent with your class schedule, which will be sent to you the middle of May.

Q. Do I have to put ten choices for each week?

A. Yes. We make every effort to give students their first choices. In a few cases, this involves assigning a student his/her first choices at different periods. Because of high and/or low enrollment in a course, it is not always possible to give first choices. This is when we go farther down the list of choices. Even if your first choices are filled, you can't go wrong, all the classes at YSI are great!!

Q. Does YSI provide morning or afternoon day care?
