Hello JMMS Families,

We hope this newsletter finds you well. We also hope that your child/children have found the beginning of the school year as rewarding and reinvigorating as we have.

One of the many items covered in the first couple of months of the school year are safety protocols. These are important aspects of maintaining a safe learning environment. Madison Middle School has conducted Intruder Drills by reviewing ALICE information (in all classes) and by walking to our rally point. We have also conducted our first fire drill of the year and will work with the Appleton Fire Department on how to safely do these drills with all of the construction that is occurring.

Staff has been trained in ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) protocol. Through the district's ALICE training, we emphasize that while schools are very safe places, the district values proactive preparation. The district's training and practices allow our staff and students to think carefully about their surroundings at school, and consider what they will do ahead of time in the case of an emergency.

Tornado, fire, and intruder drills provide our students and staff with the opportunity to practice what to do in case of an emergency and to familiarize themselves with routes and procedures. We ask every class to review these procedures for their room on two occasions, once in the first 30 days of school and again in the second semester.

While September was focused on physical safety in our school, in October, our social-emotional learning lessons will be centered around Bullying Awareness. Social and emotional safety at school is also a top priority for us. Weekly lessons will remind students how to report bullying situations (Speak Up Speak Out anonymous app), how to be an "upstander" rather than a by-stander, and the importance of being kind and considerate to everyone.

Conferences are set up so that we can together support your student's growth in their learning and the focus of these conferences will be on student growth and performance since the beginning of the school year. For JMMS P/T Conferences, we will be utilizing "My Conference Time" (MCT) as a system for parents to sign up for parent teacher conferences. In order to make our conferences more efficient and easier for our families in attendance, parents will be required to register for conferences with teachers. When scheduling your child's P/T Conferences, please keep the following in mind...

- All conferences are 7 minutes in length. If you feel like you will need longer than 7 minutes, please communicate with the teacher to set up a longer or alternative conference time.
- Some "specialists" will have 14 min conference slots
- While we encourage you to schedule time with each of your child's teachers, it is not necessary to schedule a conference with every teacher.
- Families are asked to sign up for a 7 min.conference with each of the students' teachers. (Please click the yellow box on the homepage to schedule multiple conferences.)
- Please use Infinite Campus to find a current class schedule.
- Please do not schedule back to back conferences, give yourself at least 7 minutes between each conference.

On Friday, October 4th, you will receive a letter electronically inviting you to sign up for a conference time. This notification will come around 8:00am.

Here is the process to sign up for a conference time:

- Go to https://www.myconferencetime.com/jmms
- Click the yellow box on the homepage to schedule multiple conferences. Or you can click on the name of your student's teacher if you are trying to schedule a conference with one teacher or trying to add a teacher after you've scheduled your conferences.
- Select the desired time for your conference by clicking on Sign Up
- Submit the requested information. Once you register a message will be sent to your email address

If you need an interpreter for your conference and have not received a call, please call the school office at 920.854.5425 to request a conference time. You may also call the office for assistance with scheduling a conference.

Dance, Dance!: Dances are an exciting opportunity for students to hang out with friends, meet new people, and engage in dancing, basketball, and games yet have a safe adult presence.

Without our parent chaperones, this cannot happen. This year, Dances will run in two shifts. 6th grader dances will run 4:30-6:00. The cost to enter is \$4.00. Students enter through the main doors by the office. IDs are checked and students pay. Students are then free to go to the large gym to dance, the cafeteria to purchase soda and candy (and play foosball, air hockey or ping pong) or they can go to the small gym to play basketball. If weather permits, and enough parents are chaperoning, we will open the inner courtyard for students to hang out. At 6:00, 6th graders leave. PARENTS please plan to pick up your child promptly at 6:00 in the BACK of the building in the parking lot. (The front of the building will already have 7th and 8th graders being dropped off for their dance!)

7th and 8th graders, doors will open for you at 6:30. The same procedure takes place. IDs and \$5 will be needed at the door. (Your dance cost is a little more as your dance is 30 minutes longer.) All the same opportunities are available for 7th and 8th graders! The second dance gets over at 8:30. Pick-up will be the FRONT of the building!!! Please be prompt!

PARENTS PLEASE CONSIDER CHAPERONING!!! We only hold 4 dances a year! The Student Council appreciates your efforts in helping us hold these events for students!!! To chaperone please click on this <u>link</u> or email Mrs. Steiner at <u>lawrence-stein@aasd.k12.wi.us</u>. If ample chaperones are not available by 10:00AM the day of the dance, we will be forced to cancel our dance.

Students these dances are casual dress. They are meant to be relaxing and fun! Plan to bring your ID, your \$ to get into the dance and maybe a little extra to buy soda and candy! Phones/Cameras are not permitted! Keep them out of sight if you bring one! Parents are aware that the dances are over at 6:00 or 8:30. Please arrange for your ride ahead of time.

<u>After School Clubs at JMMS</u>: Please read if your son/daughter is signed up or plans to sign up for an after-school club at Madison Middle School. Our after-school clubs will be run through our 21st Century Grant (CCLC) that is run by the Boys & Girls Club. Students must register for the after-school program to participate in any after school clubs.

Once your student has signed up through the Boys& Girls website for the CCLC after school program, they can start attending the club that they have signed up for. The Boys & Girls Club will provide your student with a snack and an opportunity for them to stay and do their homework or

receive homework help after their club has ended. The 21st Century after school program run by the Boys and Girls Club is open to all students regardless of if they are in a co-curricular club at JMMS. Attendance Information:

<u>Absence Request Process - available ONLINE:</u> Parents/guardians can use the Absence Request tool found on <u>Campus Parent/Parent Portal</u> to submit a request that informs the office in advance when their student is not going to be in school. This feature can be used as an <u>alternative</u> to the traditional phone calls to the school office. MIDDLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE EDUCATION LESSONS

In collaboration with the Appleton Police Department and Outagamie County Youth and Family Services, AASD middle schools will be providing Attendance Education Lessons for students and their families beginning in November. Families may receive a letter as determined by the school site's attendance team once their student reaches five unexcused absences. A student is considered habitually truant if they are absent from school without an excuse for part or all of five or more days on which school is held during a semester. With the letter, the family will be asked to attend a meeting with the school to develop a plan for attendance. Part of that plan will include a requirement for the student and family to participate in an Attendance Education Lesson, which will be held at each middle school monthly. Information will be shared and discussed regarding attendance requirements, state law, school obligations, the importance of attending school, and available resources to improve attendance.


