Graduation Requirements

- ▣ English 4 credits
- ▣ Math 4 credits
- ▣ Religion 4 credits
- ▣ Social Studies 3 credits
- ▣ Science 3 credits
- ▣ World Language 2 credits (same language)
- ▣ Physical Education 1 credit
- ▣ Practical/Performing Art 1 credit
- ▣ Electives 6 credits*
- ▣ Christian Service 25 hours per year



Students must maintain a cumulative **2.00 grade point average (GPA)** in order to graduate. Students take 7 credits each year at Snyder.

*Students may opt to take additional core academic courses in the 11th and 12th grade to fulfill this requirement. Please note: Some universities require 4 credits of science. Seniors are strongly encouraged to take a fourth science credit.

BASIC COURSE SEQUENCE

9TH GRADE

- Religion, English, Science, Math, P.E., World Language, Elective

10TH GRADE

- Religion, English, Science, Math, World History, World Language, Elective

11TH GRADE

- Religion, English, Science, Math, American History, two Electives*

12TH GRADE

- Religion, English, Math, Government/Economics, three Electives*

Course Requests: The 2024-2025 Course Catalog is on the school website. Details regarding the course request process for the 2025-2026 school year become available in the spring. Students must earn the required grade and fulfill any prerequisite course requirements to receive a teacher recommendation for Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) Courses. Due to the nature of the course, some electives also require a recommendation and/or application process.

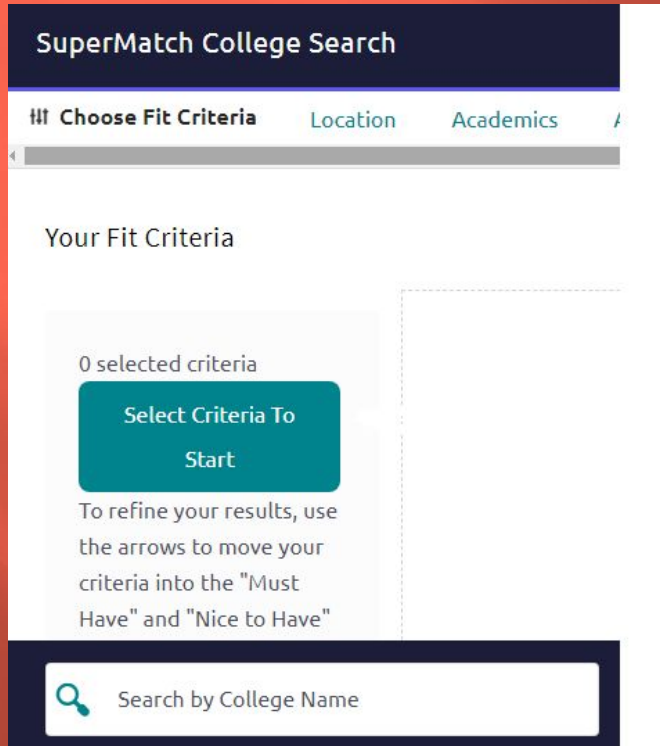

9th Grade College Roadmap

- Build strong academic and critical thinking skills by taking challenging courses.
- Explore Honors and AP options and criteria for placement.
- Build study skills to help in earning excellent grades.
- Set a GPA goal.



9th Grade College Roadmap



- Meet with school counseling to discuss plans for the next four years.
- Get involved in a club or sport and volunteer.
- Browse through college literature and Naviance to get an idea of what kind of schools may be of interest.
- Research what high school courses colleges require.
- Know the NCAA requirements to play sports in college.
- Begin to research career possibilities.

10th Grade College Roadmap

- ▣ Continue college exploration
 - Build college portfolio
 - Research college admissions process
 - ▣ Note: Military Academies
 - ▣ For students researching Military Academies: some tasks for the admissions process begin in the junior year. (Applying for congressional nomination)
 - Research Florida Bright Futures
 - Attend College Fairs
 - ▣ College Preparatory Schools Fair - in Spring
 - ▣ Tentatively in February 2025 at UNF (official date to be determined)
 - Explore summer academic programs offered at colleges and universities

10th Grade College Roadmap

- ▣ SAT/ACT/CLT Planning
 - Formulate a preparation plan
 - Visit SAT or ACT or CLT websites
 - ▣ ACT - www.actstudent.org
 - ▣ CLT - <https://www.cltexam.com/tests/>
 - ▣ SAT - www.collegeboard.org
 - ▣ SAT is now partnered with Khan Academy for SAT Practice - www.khanacademy.org/sat
- ▣ Begin to research career possibilities
- ▣ Keep an academic and extracurricular portfolio
 - Stay involved in a club or sport
 - Volunteer

11th grade College Roadmap

- Tour Colleges; Meet with Representatives
- Edit college list
- Take SAT and/or ACT and/or CLT
 - SAT
 - Scale: 400-1600
 - ACT
 - Scale: 1-36
 - CLT
 - Scale: 0-120
 - Some colleges are test-optional
 - Many colleges superscore (ie. recalculate composite score based on subscores from multiple test dates of the same type of test)
- Continue to Build Academic/Extracurricular Resume
 - Stay involved with clubs, sports, and volunteering
 - Keep up with grades/classes; finish the year strong

12th grade College Road Map

- ▣ Meet with College Representatives
- ▣ Application Process
 - for most colleges begins senior year (July / August)
 - ▢ Exceptions: Military Academies; SCAD (junior art portfolio)
 - Check each college's website for their application process
- ▣ Continue research on College Financial Aid
 - Begin searching scholarships early (many are open to non-seniors).
 - Check with College Financial Aid offices/websites
