## STUDENT GROWTH & PROFICIENCY

#### Early Childhood

Our District offers a diverse range of early childhood education options from family education, vibrant preschool programming and nature-based learning experiences. We partner with our early childhood special education team to provide support and services for our preschool students with exceptional needs. We are recognized as a 4-star Parent Aware preschool program, the highest rating possible in Minnesota.

#### Elementary


Our elementary students are assessed regularly in reading, math, and science using a variety of grade-level appropriate tools. To measure their progress against state standards, we utilize MCA tests. Students who need additional support or an added challenge receive personalized instruction.

#### Middle School

Middle school teachers and counselors use the MCA test, along with other data, to guide students in course selection. Instruction is personalized to meet the individual needs of each student.

#### High School

High school teachers assess students regularly using common assessments in each subject. Students also take nationally-normed tests like the PreACT, PSAT, and ACT at various points in their high school career. Counselors and teachers utilize this data, combined with knowledge of individual student goals and motivation, to help students select from a wide range of course offerings, including more than 250 courses and nine career pathways.



*In addition to MCA data*, White Bear Lake Area Schools utilizes a variety of local academic measures, including academic and social-emotional screeners, PreACT, ACT, and academic grades and credits, to apprise student progress.

To ensure our district remains at the forefront of education, we are focused on reimagining learning experiences to inspire student success.

A key step in this process was the unification of White Bear Lake Area High School, which will provide enhanced opportunities for our students. Additionally, we are excited to implement a trimester system at the high school starting in the 2025-26 school year. This new structure will allow for more focused learning periods and increased opportunities for student growth.

To further enrich our educational offerings, we will launch an Elementary Spanish Dual Immersion program in fall 2025, creating a bilingual environment that values diversity and cultural understanding.

At the middle school level, our teachers continue to collaborate to set high standards and provide rigorous instruction.

The 4-year graduation rate for the White Bear Lake Area High School - South Campus Class of 2023 was 93.5%, 10.2 percentage points above the state average. Graduation rate calculations follow one year behind the current graduating year.

**COLLEGE LEVEL COURSES OFFERED AT WBLAHS DURING 2023-24** 

21 Advanced Placement (AP) classes, 30 concurrent enrollment courses (CIS/CitHS) courses, and 4 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses. Students also took advantage of Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) and Northeast Metro 916 Career and Technical Center offerings.

#### **AVID**

Our middle and high school students have the opportunity to participate in the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program, which offers rigorous instruction to prepare students for college. Lakeaires Elementary is also an AVID school and uses Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR) strategies to enhance student learning.

Building Assets, Reducing Risk (BARR) programming is used in six of our schools to build strong relationships and provide early intervention support.

#### **INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE**

Since 2010, Matoska International has offered an IB World School option, providing a rigorous and globally-minded education for their elementary students.

To ensure that maximum resources reach our classrooms, White Bear Lake Area Schools remains committed to fiscal responsibility.


#### Stewardship

 Early Childhood Center and Transition Education Center (TEC) at Sunrise Park The 2019 bond referendum list of comprehensive building projects is nearing substantial completion marking an exciting chapter for White Bear Lake Area Schools. This fall, we celebrated two major milestones with the opening of two sites.

After welcoming students and families to the newly configured grades 9-12 campus for open house and back-to-school events, the community came together for a special Open House event at White Bear Lake Area High School. It was heartwarming to see hundreds of community members explore the updated spaces, enjoying the enhancements alongside our students, staff, and families.

During Homecoming week, we hosted a "Set Sail with Mariner Middle School" Open House to celebrate the opening of Mariner Middle School while honoring the rich legacy of Mariner High School. Attendees enjoyed reconnecting and reminiscing, with former Mariner High School students proudly donning their letter jackets and spotting themselves in yearbookinspired displays throughout the hallways.

The new White Bear Lake Area High School Performing Arts Center (PAC) has officially opened its doors. With seating for 800, this state-of-theart facility recently hosted its first student music performances and will serve as the venue for future events, including the high school's fall musicals.

Construction at the Sunrise Park building is progressing steadily. This winter, District Center offices will relocate to Sunrise, which is being transformed to house the District Service Center and the Senior Center. Once the administrative move is complete, School Board meetings will also transition to the new School Board Room at Sunrise Park. By Fall 2026, the building will also house the Early Childhood Center and Transition Education Center.

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In December, students, staff, alumni and community members gathered for a pre-game reception and packed the game gym at White Bear Lake Area High School. The special event took place prior to the first Boys' Basketball game. Long-time coach, teacher, and community member Jim Galvin was honored at a dedication event naming the WBLAHS gymnasium as "Galvin Court."

Galvin began his teaching and coaching career at White Bear in 1970. He served as head basketball coach from 1972 to 1998. Under Galvin's guidance, the success of the White Bear basketball program was unparalleled. His 1984 and 1985 teams won 52 consecutive games and earned back-to-back Class AA State Championships. Galvin was named State Coach of the Year in 1985. Under his leadership, the Bears won five conference championships and made three state tournament appearances.

When he was not on the sidelines, Jim was a devoted and outstanding math teacher. He is fondly remembered by alumni for his engaging teaching style and positive influence on students. During his career in White Bear, he also served as Athletic Director for almost five years.

Galvin continues to serve the school district and community. After his retirement in 2000, he returned to the classroom to serve as a substitute teacher until 2020 and hosted basketball camps through 2023. He continues to support White Bear athletics and is rarely seen out of his orange and black attire. He served on the district-wide facilities planning team and has served as a trusted, influential voice in support of the school district, always focused on what's best for students.

#### NEW SPANISH DUAL IMMERSION

The White Bear Lake Area School Board recently approved an Elementary Spanish Dual Immersion program, set to launch in Fall 2025. This program will be offered at Otter Lake Elementary and Matoska International, with each school hosting up to three kindergarten immersion classrooms for a potential total of six classrooms district-wide. Transportation will be available to resident families throughout the district for students enrolled in this program.

The new immersion program is designed to serve both Spanish-speaking and non-Spanish-speaking students together in a bilingual environment that values the contributions of every student and family. Participants will learn in a mix of English and Spanish, experiencing unique benefits such as academic growth, enhanced language and cultural understanding, social and emotional development, and expanded future opportunities.

"This is forward-thinking education. When I look in the job market, almost all of the employers want you to have a second language," said School Board Vice-Chair Angela Thompson. "I think this is another asset for our students. I'm really excited to see what this program does in the district."

Families will be able to select this option during the kindergarten registration process. Enrollment information was mailed to all incoming kindergarten families in December 2024, with the enrollment window for the 2025-26 school year opening on Dec. 16, 2024. Priority placement will be given to district students, with open enrollment applications considered after Jan. 15, 2025.

"This program addresses the needs of families seeking unique educational options, including immersion programs, and it supports multiple goals in our district's strategic plan," said Dr. Wayne Kazmierczak, Superintendent of White Bear Lake Area Schools. "We're committed to creating a safe, nurturing environment for all students, personalizing education, and helping each student recognize and develop their unique talents."
