

Pelham City Schools' Goals for Student Achievement 2024–2025

In Math: All students demonstrate growth and score Proficient or higher in math on the Georgia Milestones EOG test.

In Literacy: All students demonstrate growth in reading and writing and score Proficient or higher on the Georgia Milestones EOG test.

Behavior: Increase Climate Star Rating scores by continuing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Capturing Kids' Hearts strategies, and reducing office discipline referrals.

In Math- Our focus will be on number and fact fluency and word problems.

In Literacy- Our focus will be on reading comprehension, reading stamina and vocabulary, specifically informational text and research.

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

In Fourth Grade

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of the ways we will accomplish this include:

- Provide math homework and flashcards each day and encourage parents to support students by ensuring they complete work.
- Encourage parents to have students read daily and ask who, what, when, where, and why.
- Provide parent resources in math and reading through parent events, the PIRC, monthly digital parent newsletter and online websites.
- Stay in communication with parents through weekly folders and monthly parent newsletter.

At Home

PES parents worked with staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math at home. Some of the suggestions include:

- Encourage students to read each day and talk with parent about it.
- Practice fact fluency, encourage using Read, Draw, Write, for multi-step word problems.
- Access online resources for more practice or help, (Zearn, ReadWorks) and visit the Public Library when possible.
- Stay informed with weekly agenda and monthly digital parent newsletter via email, Facebook, Remind, the PCS website, Dojo, and in the school lobby.
- Attend parent events or access information on the school website (online access in the PIRC and public library), and sign up for parent engagement Remind updates.
- Communicate with teachers through conferences and sign agenda nightly.
- Discuss social contract and target word

4th Grade Students

A sampling of Pelham Elementary School students were asked their ideas about how they can succeed in Math and Literacy. Students thought of the following ways to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Complete daily math homework and practice math facts.
- Read daily within Lexile level and use free apps available on the PCS website, and read informational text at home.
- Visit the public libraries and programs.
- Talk to parents about school each day.
- Use websites such as ReadWorks, Zearn, and Nitro Type for support.
