HELP INFORM KCPS KINDERGARTEN


KINDERGARTEN BIRTHDATE ENTRY ADJUSTMENT:

- Current Policy: Kindergarten entry is based on a birthdate cut-off of August 31st.
- Proposed Change: Shift the entry date to July 31st, aligning with Missouri state guidelines.
- Why the Change? The change would help solve problems between Missouri's Pre-K funding guidelines and the federal Head Start Pre-K funding guidelines. It also wants to make sure kids who start Kindergarten are five years old, ready and prepared.






We're once again heading out into the community!

Mission

3. Execute older DAC items and bring those to the forefront as well as stabilizing the SOPs and reviewing by-laws.





Elevating Equity Committee

A Dedicated Team of Parents & Community Members Engaging with Title I Schools and Supporting Schools in Need

- **Community-Driven Support**: Bringing together passionate parents and community advocates with free time to actively engage with schools other than their own.
- Focused on Equity: Providing extra attention and resources to Title I schools and students.
- Building Stronger Connections: Creating partnerships that bridge schools, families, and community resources.



Part 1: DAC Delegate Training

Which parent organization works best for your school?

PTA: Parent Teacher Association

- Mission: To make every child's potential a reality by engaging and empowering families and communities.
- PTA is a nationally recognized organization. A larger network supporting child advocacy and education across the country.
- Focuses on influencing and advocating policies at school, district, state, and national levels to improve education and family support. Encourages active parent participation in school events, committees, and decision-making processes. (Examples: School choice vouchers, gun safety, special education etc.)
- Provides parents and school staff with training, resources, and best practices to support student success. They'll work with a school with at least 10 people who are ready to get their PTA off the ground.
- We have a local rep who can get one started!

PTO: Parent Teacher Organization

- Independent parent led group. Not required to register anywhere like the PTA. No national umbrella association.
- Flexible mission and goals that's adaptable, autonomous and works closely with school admin and teachers to address specific needs.
- Advocacy not required. PTOs usually focus on parent involvement, school/teacher/student support and community-building at their local school.
 - So much freedom. Your PTO can be what you all want to focus on.
 - Provides opportunities for parents to volunteer, support classrooms, and engage with school staff and students.

SAC: School Advisory Committee

- School-based group intended to represent the school, the community, and those persons closest to the students.
- There are officer roles, bylaws, voting, and following parliamentary procedure.
- SACs some times have an advisory body to school admin, usually focusing on school policy, curriculum, and strategic planning. SACs are often composed of parents, teachers, community members, and sometimes students, who provide input on broader school issues.

Strategies for Amplifying Everyone's voice

- Create a Safe Space: Encourage open dialogue and show appreciation for all input.
- Ask for Input Directly: Gently invite their thoughts during discussions.
- Provide Alternative Ways to Share: Use anonymous suggestions or oneon-one follow-ups.
 - Acknowledge Contributions: Recognize their ideas publicly to build confidence.
