Unfunded Materials, Supplies & Operating DISTRICT-WIDE Costs



Ephrata School District is considered a property-poor district, making us eligible for Local Effort Assistance (LEA) funding from the state. This program provides an additional \$3.2 - \$3.3 million annually in additional support, but only if the levy passes. That's more than we generate through local taxes.



costs to run a school district.


HISTORIC LEVY RATES
