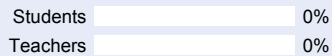

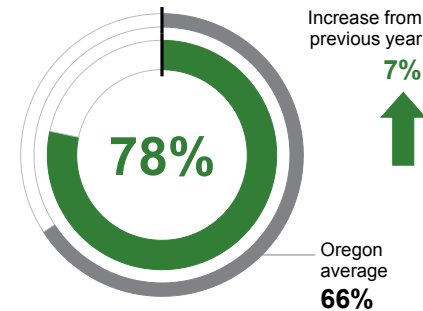
CLASS SIZE

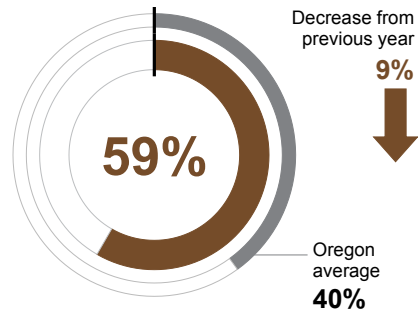

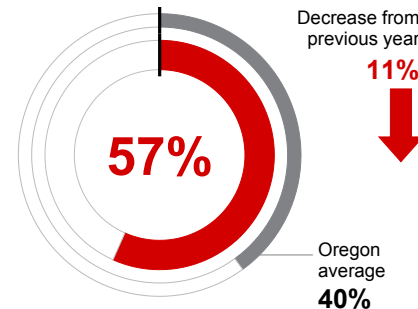
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



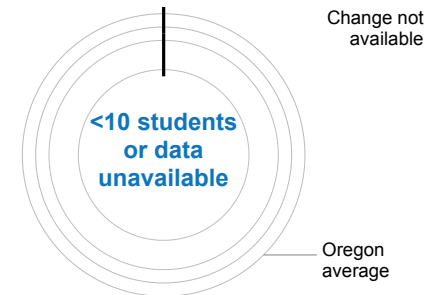
MATHEMATICS

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

We are dedicated to maintaining an inclusive environment where students are not only welcomed and supported but also feel socially, emotionally, and physically safe. Systems and supports include:

Plans and protocols in place for weather events, fires, accidents, intruders, and other threats to safety. These protocols are practiced on a regular schedule throughout the school. We use the I Love You Guys standard response protocol.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

All students at Grant Watts participate in Physical Education, Music, and Library classes each week. Grade levels participate in musical performances for families and community members throughout the year in our High School auditorium. We also recognize students who exemplify our Profile of a Graduate characteristics. These children demonstrate they are caring, leaders, communicators, thinkers, and show principle.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Grant Watts enjoys an active and supportive parent organization in our GWPO, and new members are always welcome to volunteer in a variety of ways at our school. There are monthly events to bring families together like Harvest Fest, Family Movie Night, and the Hearts & Arrows Dance. As a school, we host events including a Back to School Night, Fall/Spring Conferences, Kindergarten Connect, and opportunities to meet with the Principal throughout the year.
