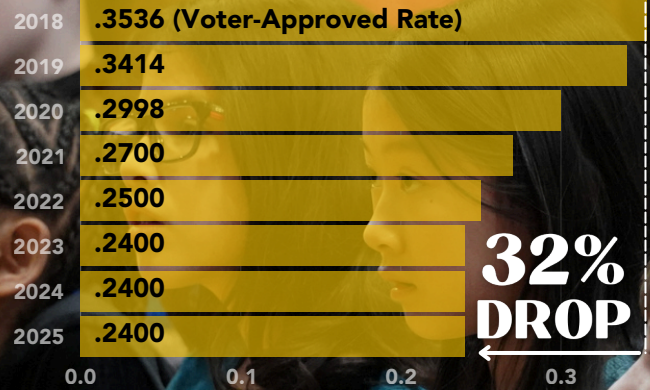




2025 REFERENDUM PROGRESS REPORT

In 2018, Avon-Washington Township voters approved an operating referendum to support Avon's students and educators. We have never used these funds for transportation, construction/renovation, administrative positions, or technology/equipment. This report shows the impact the referendum has had on our students and educators.



Our Falling Tax Rate

We have lowered the voter-approved tax rate by nearly a third since 2018.



Promises Made & Kept

Voters shared clear priorities with district leaders who, in turn, promised to use referendum funds for three exclusive purposes:

- 1 LOWER CLASS SIZES**
- 2 INCREASED TEACHER COMPENSATION**
- 3 MORE STUDENT SUPPORT & ACTIVITIES**

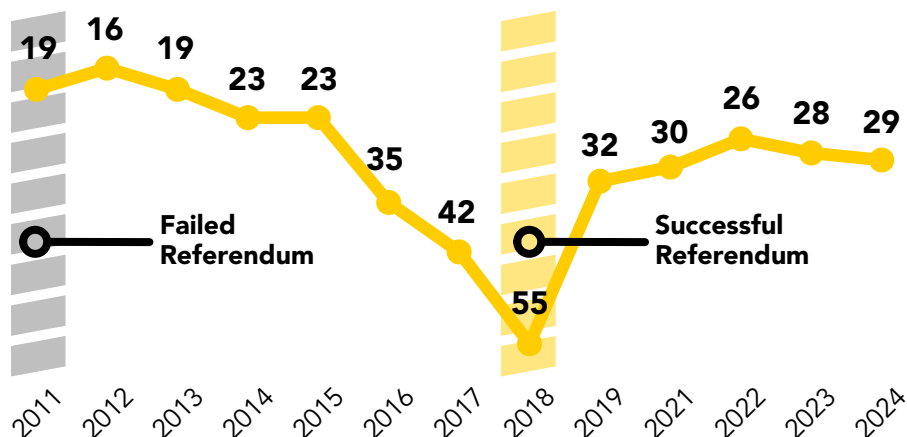

Thanks to seven school years of lower class sizes, more competitively paid educators, and increased student supports, students are performing in the top 10% of Indiana school districts.
