CAMPS

Summer Safari Camps (June–August): week-long experiences featuring fun live animals, games, activities and crafts. Half-day options offered for 4-5 year olds. *Registration for summer begins in February; Zoo members receive early access*.

Camp for a Day: Check back often for new offerings! Camps are often held on days when schools are closed throughout the year (ex. President's Day, Spring Break, Thanksgiving Break). Perfect for parents or caregivers preparing for the holidays or looking for a way to keep minds active during breaks from school.



SNOOZES AND TWILIGHT TREKS

Snoozes and Overnights: Join us for a family overnight at the zoo - an experience you will always remember! Activities include animal meet & greets, Keeper talks, and night hikes before settling in for the night. *Participants must be 5 years old and accompanied by an adult*.

Twilight Treks: Bring the family for an evening adventure! Similar to our snoozes, activities include animal meet & greets, Keeper talks, and a tour of Zoo grounds.



ADDITIONAL OFFERINGS

Animal Tales (Ages 3–5), Shake, Rattle & Roll (Ages 12–36 months), and Stroller Safari (Ages 0–3 years): Sessions are themed including topics such as Animal Athletes, Nursery Rhymes and holiday themes. Join us at the Zoo for stories, dancing, singing and games!
