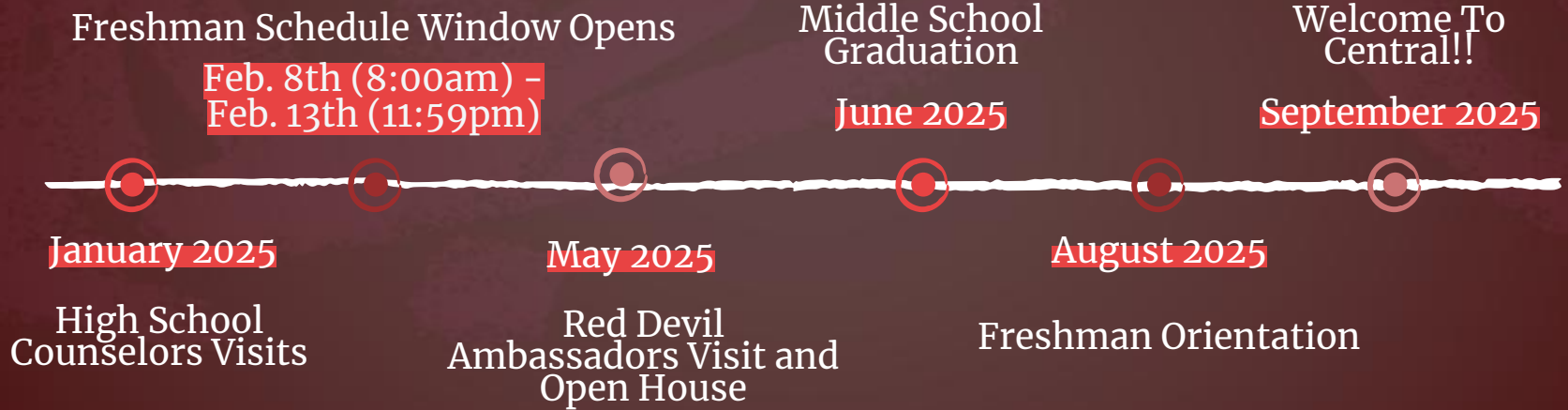

Graduation Requirements cont.

- 120 total credits are required for graduation
- To meet this requirement, all students must schedule at least 30 credits per year
- Students will meet with their grade level counselor to draft a 4-year plan that will outline their course goals for their entire high school career
- Students will meet with their grade level counselor each year to complete scheduling and track graduation progress
- For those students that are interested in accelerating in Science and/or Social Studies (ex. AP Environmental Science and AP U.S. History), please note these classes are 10 credits and will meet daily for a full year.

ELECTIVES

- Students could elect up to 10 elective credits, each year.
- Students will also select alternates for each of the elective choices, priority 1-5
- Full year electives are 5 credits and semester electives are 2.5 credits.
- Reminder, graduation requirements include:
 - 5 credits in Fine Arts
 - 5 credits in 21st Century Life & Careers or Career Tech Ed
 - 2.5 credits in Personal Finance
