JOB DESCRIPTION:

Using the skills and knowledge developed as a Corpsmember, you will continue to support the Greater Valley Conservation Corps by acting as a mentor to other Corpsmembers, in addition to other duties specified by the Greater Valley Conservation Corps Leader. Corpsmembers implement a wide variety of projects with parks, schools, businesses, non-profit and neighborhoods, including collection, outreach and education. Natural resource jobs can and will include, but not limited to; landscape maintenance, tree trimming, demolition, bark projects, habitat restoration and invasive species removal.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Recycling Division:

1. Collect recyclables from parklands and recreational areas throughout the San Joaquin, Tuolumne, Stanislaus, Calaveras and Amador Counties, including driving to location, sorting of materials, and assessing maintenance needs of Greater Valley Conservation Corps recycling program.
2. Ensure the recycling materials are measured through established monthly tracking system.
3. Work closely with other crew members during routes, outreach events and special projects.
4. Outreach to community organizations, schools, businesses, residents and provide recycling information and creative reuse solutions in a variety of settings.
5. Promote sustainability to the Greater Valley Conservation Corps community through recycling lessons, management of a recycling incentives program, and other activities.
6. Recycling activities will also include; electronic waste collection/outreach, used tire collection/outreach, and used oil collection/outreach.

Natural Resource Division:

1. Working in outdoor habitat restoration projects, landscape sites and many other outdoor and indoor natural resource environments.
2. Landscaping and using power tools such as weed eaters, mowers, blowers and various tools.
3. Habitat restoration projects will include; staking trees, discing, removal of invasive species, seed planting and storing.
4. Tire and Demolition projects can and may include using a forklift, working in severe climates indoors and outdoors. Also using power tools and other heavy equipment.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Employees in this position must have the ability to:

1. Demonstrate normal manual dexterity and eye-hand coordination to operate power and motorized equipment using both hands.
2. Demonstrate physical agility to frequently stop, kneel, bend, crouch, reach overhead, grasp, push, pull, lift and move objects up to 50 pounds shoulder height and occasionally lift in excess of 50 pounds with assistance.
3. Demonstrate normal depth perception.
4. Stand and walk for extended periods.
5. See and read printed matter, with or without visual aids, distinguish colors, read and understand rules and policies, labels and instructions.
