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




Hello, Downingtown Area School District!

FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN IN 2025-26

District administration has proposed a plan to provide full-day kindergarten in all DASD elementary schools starting in the 2025-26 school year. The plan includes expansion and renovation at some elementary schools, as well as the hiring of additional teachers and support staff members.

As the district continues to grow and enrollment increases, the board and administration have strategically evaluated options to provide robust educational opportunities, appropriate class sizes and equity across the district.

More than 86% of districts across Pennsylvania provide districtwide full-day kindergarten. DASD currently offers half-day



kindergarten to all students. A limited number of qualifying students may elect to participate in full-day kindergarten exclusively at Beaver Creek, Bradford Heights, East Ward and Lionville Elementary Schools.

By adding full-day kindergarten at all elementary schools, our youngest learners will receive expanded learning opportunities, which include dedicated time to develop academic, physical, social and emotional skills. SCHOOL START TIMES IN 2024-25

In an effort to promote overall student health and to ensure our students are provided the opportunity to reach their greatest potential, the DASD board approved the following revised school schedule for the 2024-25 school year.

Elementary (K-6): 9:00 a.m. - 3:35 p.m. Secondary (7-12): 8:00 a.m. - 2:45 p.m.

We understand that this change will affect traffic patterns in the mornings and afternoons. We ask for your continued understanding as we prioritize the well-being of our students.

The American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Sleep Medicine both recommend that teens between the ages of 13 and 18 get at least 8-10 hours of sleep per night. Based on the findings from both the Youth Truth survey and the DASD PAYS data, the majority of our DASD high school students are getting less than 8 hours of sleep per night. Studies have found that getting less-than-the-recommended amount of sleep each night impacts both student health and academic achievement.

BUDGET

Downingtown Area School District strives to maximize resources to maintain high-quality academics and student support systems, with the **third-lowest per pupil instructional expenses across Chester County's 12 school districts.** DASD has maintained a AAA financial rating for the past 15 years, and received the National Association of School Business Officials Meritorious Budget award for the past 19 years. Though the district has been able to maintain a zero percent tax increase eight of the past 11 years, escalating costs, increasing enrollment and implementing full-day kindergarten present challenges that require additional resources. **To safeguard a bright future for all DASD students and uphold our reputation for excellence, the district is proposing a 3.9% tax increase for the 2024-25 school year.**

Fortunately, the state has increased the 2024 funding to support the Homestead Property Relief Program, providing homeowners with approximately \$50 in additional tax relief funds. With the additional tax relief, the net tax impact will be approximately 3% for homeowners. The increased overall tax revenue will directly support the expansion of DASD facilities to address growing enrollment, additional staff to support students' educational and social-emotional needs, as well as essential core and extracurricular programs and resources.

DASD is committed to using district funds responsibly to ensure a strong future for our schools and community. We recognize the financial impact any tax increase may have on residents, and this decision is not taken lightly. Investing in our schools increases property values, fosters a more educated workforce and provides a safe and nurturing environment for our children to learn. Across Pennsylvania, DASD has grown to become the sixth largest among 500 school districts. This achievement highlights our dedication to educational excellence and the trust our community places in us. As we embrace this growth, we remain vigilant in tracking enrollment trends and crafting strategic responses to meet the evolving needs of our community.

During the 2023-24 school year, DASD hired demographics firm FutureThink to complete an enrollment study. The study looked at live birth rates, projected housing growth, DASD student retention rates and the amount of available open space in our district to create enrollment projections by grade level.

Overall, the study projected a 10-year enrollment growth of 750 students. The study did not account for the addition of full-day kindergarten, which will likely further increase elementary enrollment as students return to the district from charter schools.

FACILITIES PLANS

In order to respond to the district's growing population, DASD must expand its facilities through renovations and additions.

- Additions and renovations at Downingtown East and West High Schools will be completed summer 2024
- Additions and renovations at Beaver Creek and West Bradford Elementary Schools will be completed summer 2025
- Renovations to create space for full-day kindergarten will be completed prior to its launch in fall 2025
- Additional projects on hold pending future funding include
 - Bradford Heights Elementary & Lionville Elementary School additions
 - Brandywine Wallace
 Elementary School expansion
 - 5-6 Center
 - Addressing needs of aging facilities

OPEN HOUSES

Stay tuned for community open houses this fall at Uwchlan Hills Elementary, STEM, Downingtown HS East and Downingtown HS West.

SIEMENS PROPERTY

Located in Uwchlan Township, the Siemens property (a.k.a. Lionville Station Farm) was purchased by DASD from Siemens Medical Solutions for \$22 million in 2003 with the intent of building a third secondary campus. At that time, DASD was unable to gain the necessary zoning change in order to construct a school building.



- In 2014, DASD entered into a sales agreement with Hankin Group. Hankin was unable to gain zoning approval for their proposed residential and retail development, and, after seven years, they terminated their agreement with the district.
- In February 2022, DASD entered a sales agreement with Carvana, LLC. for \$87,817,000. Carvana withdrew from the sales agreement in March 2022.
- In July 2022, DASD entered into a sales agreement with Audubon Land Development for \$96,000,000. In October 2023, Audubon ended the sales agreement.

During the last decade, DASD has seen, and is projected to see, student enrollment growth primarily in the central and southern portions of the district. Due to the areas of enrollment growth and zoning, the Siemens property is no longer an appropriate location for a school building. Funding from the sale of this property and subsequent development by the buyer will support district programming, staffing and facility needs, while helping to slow the increase in annual millage rate for our taxpayers.
