

A foundation of **EQUITY** across all literacy practices ensures opportunities and access for every learner every day.

Section 1a: Literacy Vision and Mission Statement

Literacy Vision: It is our vision to promote well-rounded learners with a love for literacy through quality instruction, high expectations, and opportunities for growth.

Literacy Mission Statement: J.S. Aucoin Elementary, with the help of teachers, families, and community partners, will ensure students develop reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills to become life-long learners.

Section 1b: Goals

Goal 1 (Student-Focused): 65% of students, with the inclusion of EL and Special Education, will meet or exceed individual growth goals by May 2025, based on data collected from BOY and EOY state approved literacy screener, DIBELS. Explicit strategies for vocabulary (KIMS) and reading comprehension (UNRAAVEL) are used school-wide.

Goal 2 (Teacher-Focused): 100% of ELA teachers will participate in professional development to build their capacity as an effective teacher in the area of literacy. This includes the Science of Reading training.

Goal 3 (Program-Focused): To implement a Literacy Program that includes a Tier I curriculum (Amplify CKLA), provides tiered support for students (DIBELS, Lexia), and is monitored through weekly PLCs and current data.


