Trump Appeals to Supreme Court

Back in May of 2024, President Elect Donald Trump was convicted on 34 felony counts of falsifying business records in



order to pay out hush money to Stormy Daniels. His sentencing by Judge Juan M. Merchan was scheduled for this Friday, January 10. However, Trump's legal team has sought to postpone his sentencing on the grounds that it will be a barrier to him as he takes office later this month, on January 20. New York courts refused to postpone, so this Wednesday, the team took their appeal up to the US Supreme Court.

Lawyers John Sauer and Todd Blanche are arguing that the Supreme Court's July decision that protects US presidents from criminal prosecution for official acts (previously used to defend Trump against prosecution for inciting the January 6 riot) may also apply to this case despite the fact that the falsification of business records took place before Trump was elected for the first time. They are currently attempting to not only postpone sentencing, but also to overturn Trump's conviction entirely. This appeal to the Supreme Court is an incredibly important one because, for the first time in American history, it will set clear boundaries on what president immunity (which has never been well defined) does and does not apply to. As the beginning of the New Year has sprung on us, it can only mean one thing. New hobbies and habits! One personal goal for 2025 is to bake and cook more often. As a pretty inexperienced cook I knew I had to start with something on the smaller side. I chose to make some delicious chocolate chip cookies if I do say so myself. Below is attached the exact recipe that I used for the cookies. I thought if anyone else would like to follow along on this journey with me, each week I will select, make, rate, and share each recipe!!

Recipe site : Joy FOOD Sunshine Ingredients :

- 1 cup salted butter softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup light brown sugar packed
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs
- 3 cups all-purpose flour

- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ¹/₂ teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 2 cups chocolate chips (12 oz)

Instructions :

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Line three baking sheets with parchment paper and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl mix flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
- 3. Cream together butter and sugar until combined.
- 4. Beat in eggs and vanilla until light (about 1 minute).
- 5. Mix in the dry ingredients until combined.
- 6. Add chocolate chips and mix well.
- 7. Roll 2-3 Tablespoons (depending on how large you like your cookies) of dough at a time into balls and place them evenly spaced on your prepared cookie sheets.
- 8. Bake in a preheated oven for approximately 8-10 minutes. Take them out when they are just barely starting to turn brown.
- 9. Let them sit on the baking pan for 5 minutes before removing to a cooling rack

Texas Rep. Kay Granger Retires By Michael Hayden

81-year-old Texas Representative Kay Granger has been missing from Washington since



July 24 - or had been, until just before Christmas. Granger is the Chairwoman Emeritus of the Appropriations Committee, and as such responsible for the US's

discretionary spending; however, amidst the recent debates over the federal government's spending bill for the coming year, Granger was conspicuously absent. On December 20, her voters in Fort Worth finally got the answers to their many questions about where she's been when *The Dallas Express* verified that she is, in fact, in an assisted living facility. Her son, Brandon Granger, confirmed two days later that she has been struggling with dementia.

Despite her clear inability to represent her district and her committee, Granger aides did nothing to help find a suitable replacement for her. In fact, by permanently closing her office before Thanksgiving, a month and a half before the end of her term, they seem to have been actively trying to conceal her illness until her scheduled retirement - thereby robbing her district of its voice in Congress until she was finally replaced by Craig Goldman last Friday, January 3, more than five months after Granger cast her last vote.

This isn't the first time something like this has happened. Just two years ago, concerns were raised that California Senator Dianne Feinstein, 89 years old at the time, was no longer fit to serve. Colleagues of hers who had known her for 15 years said that she needed to be reintroduced to them multiple times in one conversation. Several of her staff anonymously confirmed to the *San Francisco Chronicle* that, while she had good days and bad days, this was typically of her bad days. The idea of an upper age limit for elected officials was brought up in response, but nothing ever came of it. Feinstein died in office about a year later.

A coworker of Feinstein's said, as a protest to the attempts to persuade the Senator to step aside, "It shouldn't end this way for her. She

deserves better." While I don't agree with the sentiment, the words are true: she should have had a dignified, willing retirement. However, that would have meant retiring earlier, before her mental state began to decline. Full retirement age in America is 66; I would implore our politicians to give themselves the dignity of retiring at a reasonable age.
