MATH OPTIONS

4 Years are required. See the POS for increased options available that fit your future.

SCIENCE/STEM OPTIONS

Make sure you have completed the required 2 Science credits in Biology and Chemistry and 1 STEM credit for graduation. It is recommended college bound students complete a 3rd science credit such as a level of Physics.



VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL



- Vo-Tech requests should submit 6.5 credits
- A separate Vo-Tech application is required for all Vo-Tech students (new and continuing)
- Indicate the Vo-Tech program number during registration

SUBSTITUTE COURSES

The substitute course section of the registration is to be filled in completely

- ▶ Substitute courses must be different than the original requests
- ▶ Substitutes will be used if a scheduling conflict occurs or if a selected course is closed

Course selection changes may be made through June 6, 2025



SUMMER SCHOOL/ENRICHMENT

Registration opens January 9, 2025

Acceleration:

- ▶ Do not include the course on your registration form
- ▶ Can only request up to 1.0 credit
- ▶ Letter grades are calculated into each nine weeks of the upcoming school year

Credit Recovery:

- ▶ Pass/Fail courses
- ▶ Grade will be applied to this school year



EARLY RELEASE

Seniors will be eligible to request:

- 9th period early release
- 8th and 9th period early release

But:

- Some class selections will not allow it to happen
- Early release does not guarantee a parking pass
- Class sizes will not be compromised to accommodate for early release
- Must have a minimum of 6.0 credits
- There will be a box to check on the registration sheet
