## A. <u>Student/Staff Recognition</u> –

- Last month, 28 Seneca Valley students in grades 7-9 were chosen to participate in the third annual Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) District 5 String Fest. This one-day festival was held at Beaver Area High School and featured students from eight school districts across Beaver, Butler, Lawrence and Mercer counties.
- 2. The Holocaust Center of Pittsburgh has named James Lucot, a Seneca Valley Senior High School teacher, among this year's Righteous Among the Neighbors honorees. Mr. Lucot is being celebrated for his many years of exceptional teaching on the Holocaust and his dedication to Holocaust education. Lucot joins 10 other individuals in the second class of Righteous Among the Neighbors, an award that honors non-Jewish Pittsburghers who have demonstrated dedication to uprooting antisemitism and supporting the Jewish community. The 2024 honorees will be celebrated at a public event next month at the Jewish Community Center of Greater Pittsburgh.
- 3. Auditions were recently held for the 2024 Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) District 5 Honors Band at Grove City College. Over 200 students auditioned for a band of 125 musicians. This year, Seneca Valley had 36 students earn a position in the Honors Band, more than any other school. District 5 is comprised of all school districts in Beaver, Butler, Lawrence and Mercer counties. To audition, students must be in at least ninth grade and

prepare a piece from a predetermined solo list for each school year. These college-level solos are then selected by the directors of District 5. The three-day festival culminated with a concert in Ketler Auditorium at Grove City College on Dec.14. Seneca Valley secondary band instructors include Mr. Varden Armstrong, Mr. Robert Babick, Ms. Sara Snyder and Mr. Brian Croach.

4. Jeremy Womer, Haine Middle School Assistant Principal, was recently selected as Pennsylvania's 2025 Outstanding Assistant Principal by the Pennsylvania Principals Association. As a state winner in the National Association of Elementary School Principals (NAESP) National Outstanding Assistant Principal (NOAP) Program, Mr. Womer is eligible to be considered for the honor of NAESP National Outstanding Assistant Principal of the Year. The committee chose him for his dedication, professionalism, leadership and love of learning for students, faculty, the school and community.
