Our goal at ECHS is for each of our scholars to attain both their high school diploma and their associate's degree

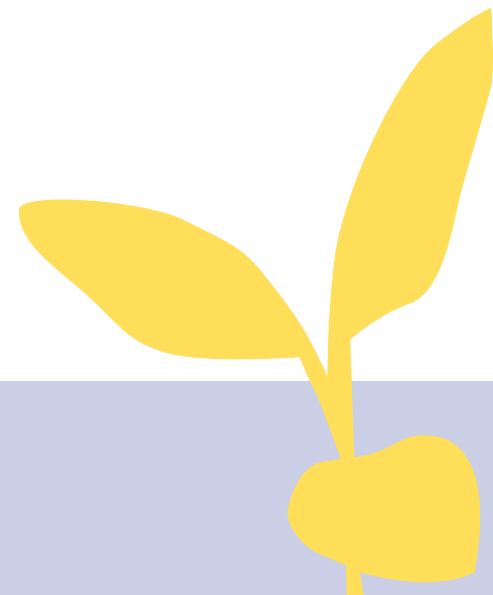

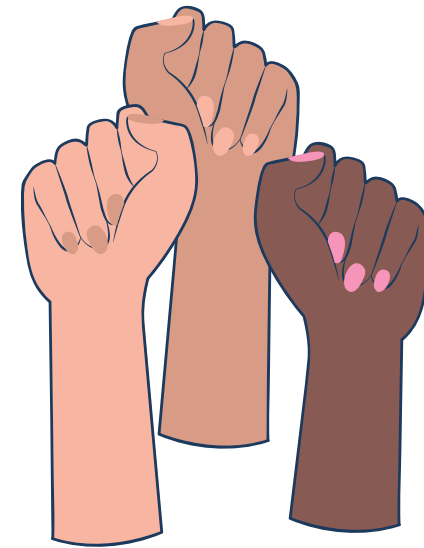
Motivated

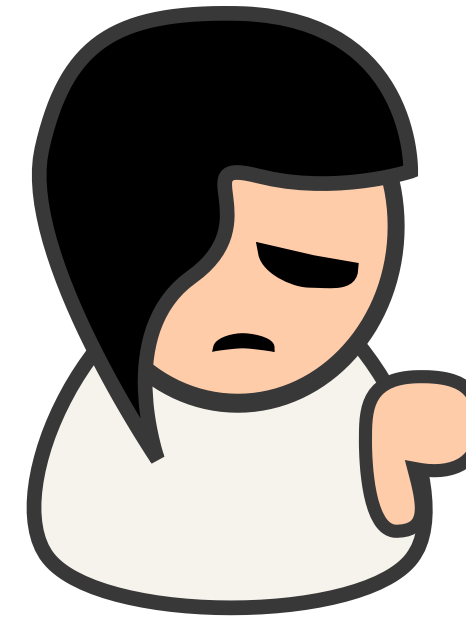
Forced

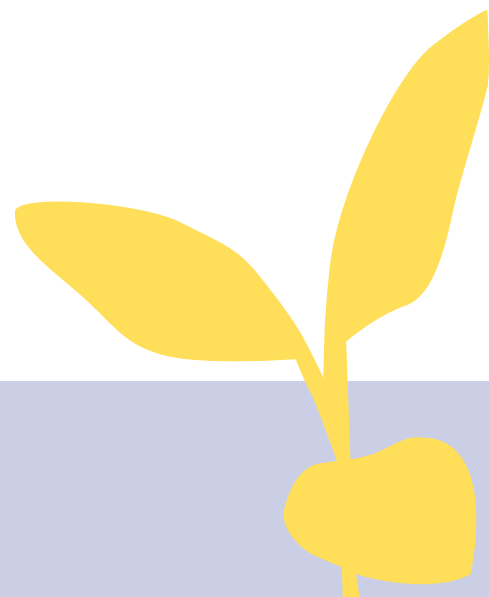
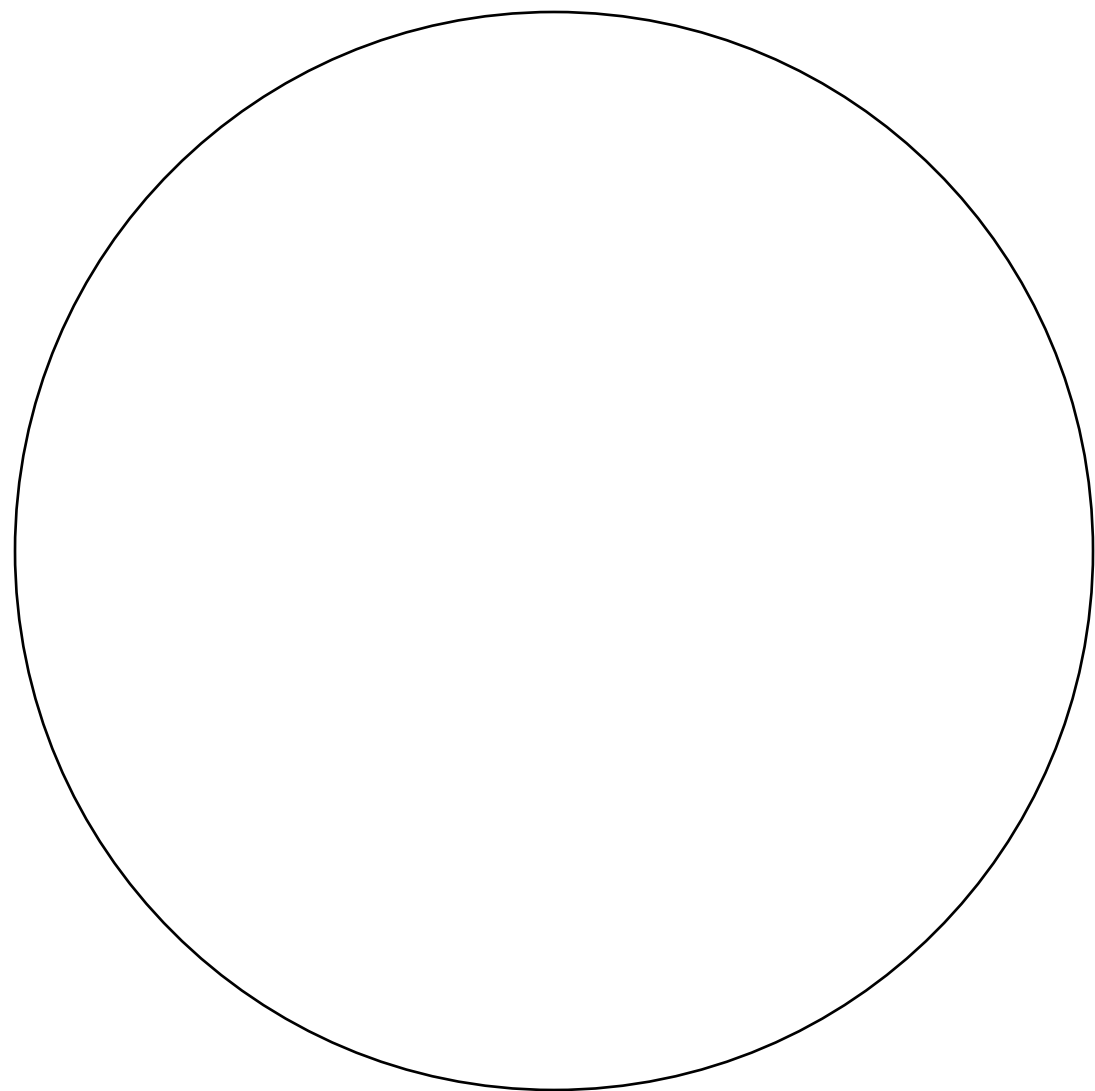

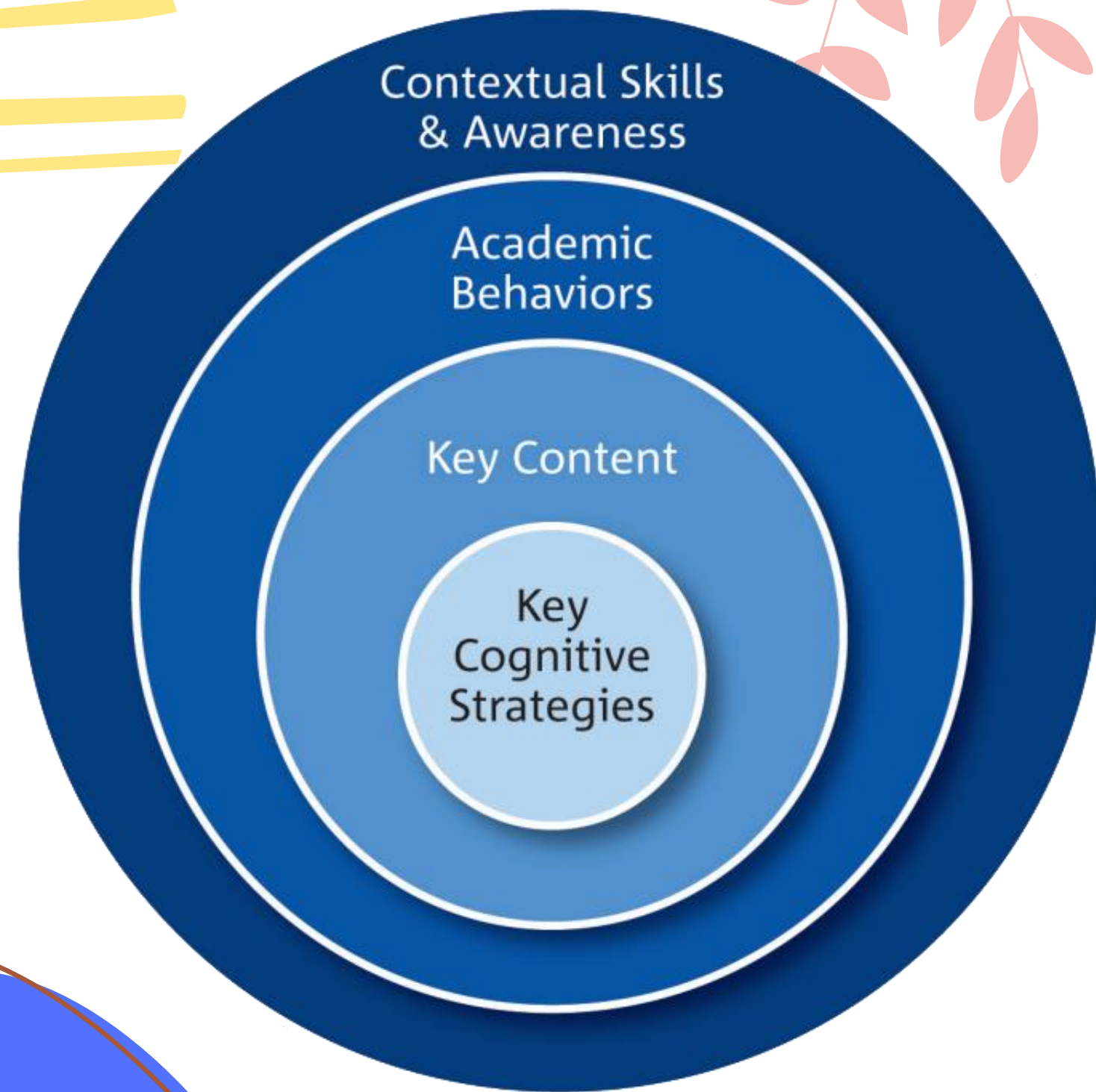

ECCHS

- UIL Academics Only
- Pre-AP, AP, College courses with accelerated track No modified curriculum
- Earn up to 60 hours, earn an associate's degree with free tuition, books and testing fees.
- Smaller school and mandatory AVID
- Associate's degree classes are the classes our students take – Narrow focus
- Our upperclassmen attends school Mon-Thurs and take classes on the TCC SE campus

Traditional Schools

- UIL Athletics & UIL Fine arts
- Diversity in HS Courses: Traditional, Advanced Classes, and Ben Barber option
- Can earn 24 – 48 hours of college credit.
- Larger school environment
- Students select courses based on career and extra-curricular involvement

High School Standards

- Attendance – 90% rule
- Behavior – HS teachers can manage students. School can suspend.
- Will teach note taking & processing skills - AVID
- Homework Help– Go to Tutoring
- Grade: A-F Percentage
- Parent Advocacy – a parent can email a high school teacher
- The teacher encourages learning and accountability and will teach what that looks like
- HS provides structure and discipline

College Standards

- Instructor Discretion – drop student at any time due to attendance
- Behavior – College instructors do not manage kids. They will remove students from class.
- Must know how to take and process notes
- Study Help – Attend office hours
- Grade: Letter grade, percentage, points
- Student Advocacy – Students must reach out to professors. The professor will not answer emails from parents
- Professor expects learning and accountability from students. It is not their job to teach what that looks like.
- College provides freedom and independence

Can a Student be Removed From ECHS

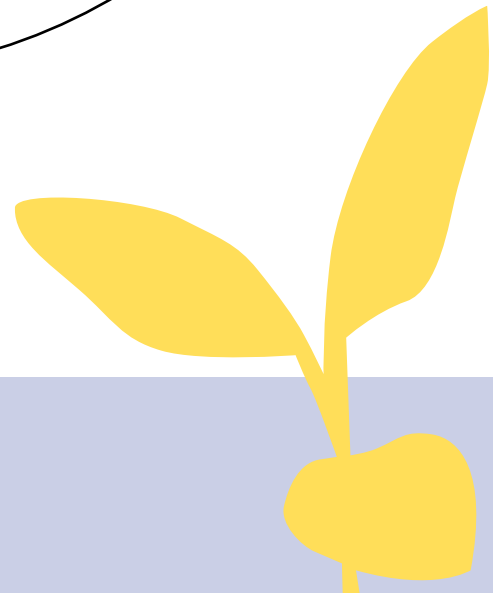
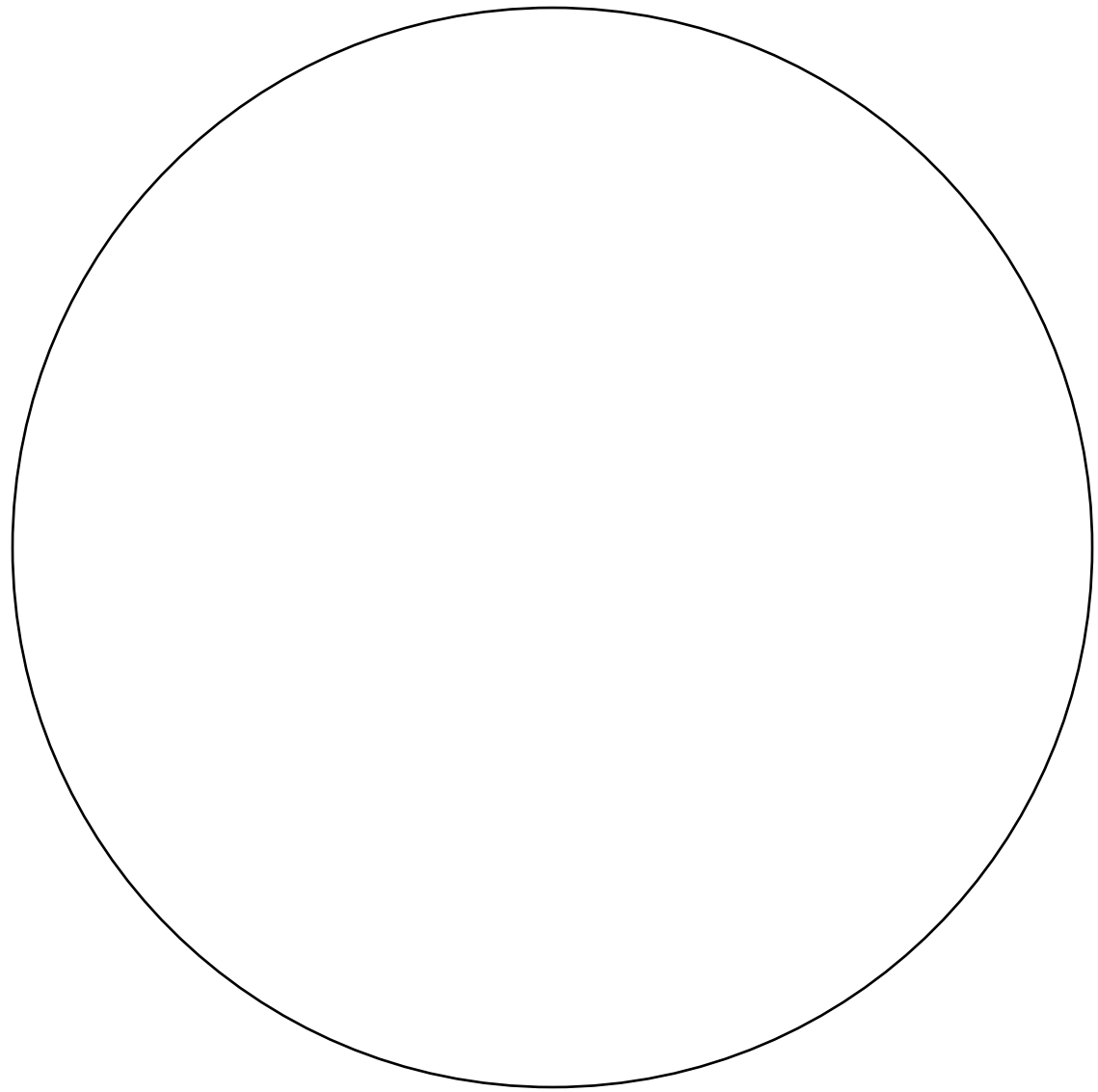
The following may result in removal from ECHS:

- Excessive absences
- Reoccurring failing grades that prevent promotion
 - Serious and persistent misconduct
- Cannot pass TSI ELAR prior to 11th grade year

Student Withdrawal

Families who do not want to be apart of the school can also withdrawal from school with an exit conference by the end of the semester or before the 90% attendance rule takes an effect.

Do TCC Classes Transfer to All Universities?

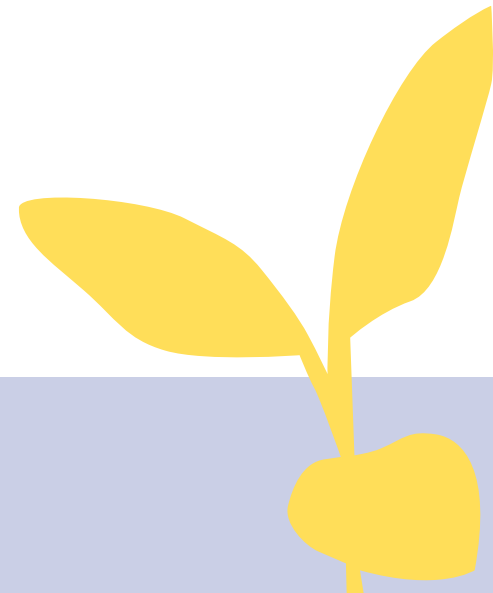
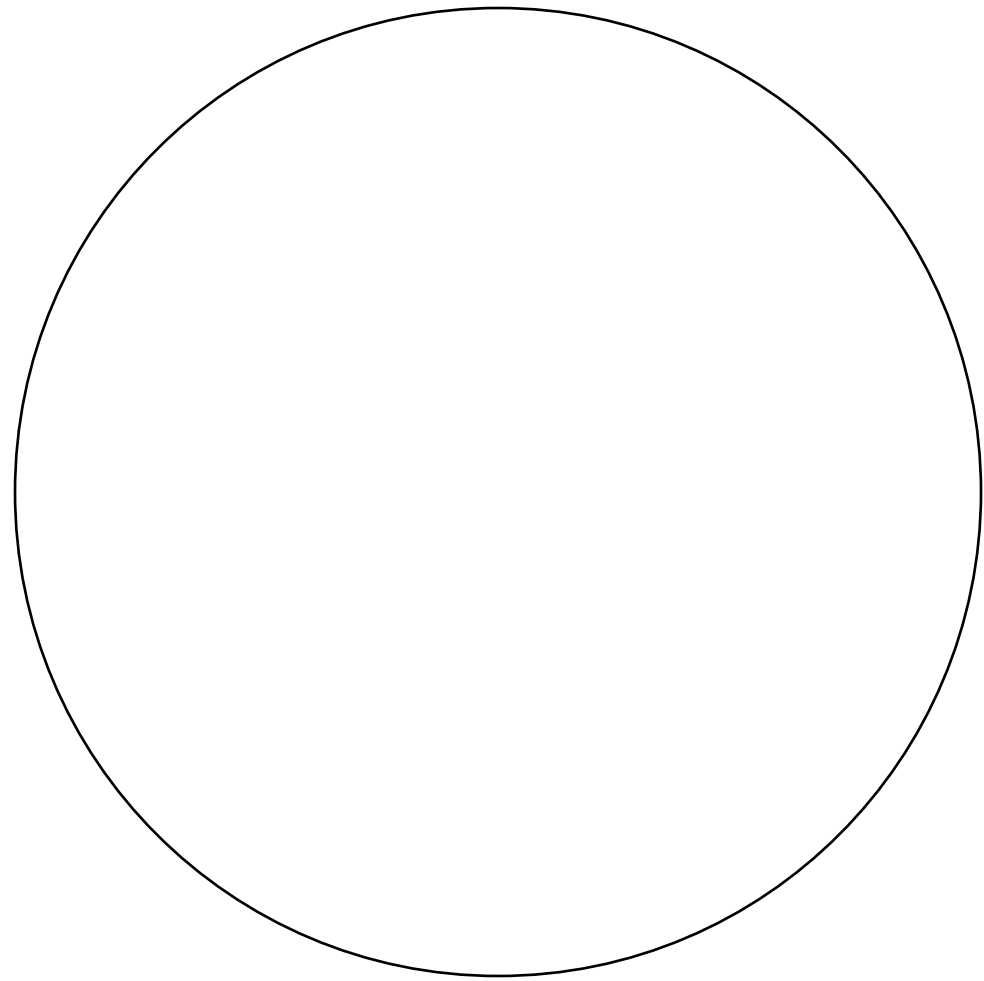
IMPORTANT!

TCC College Credit is transferrable to Texas state four-year colleges & universities and some out-of-state institutions.

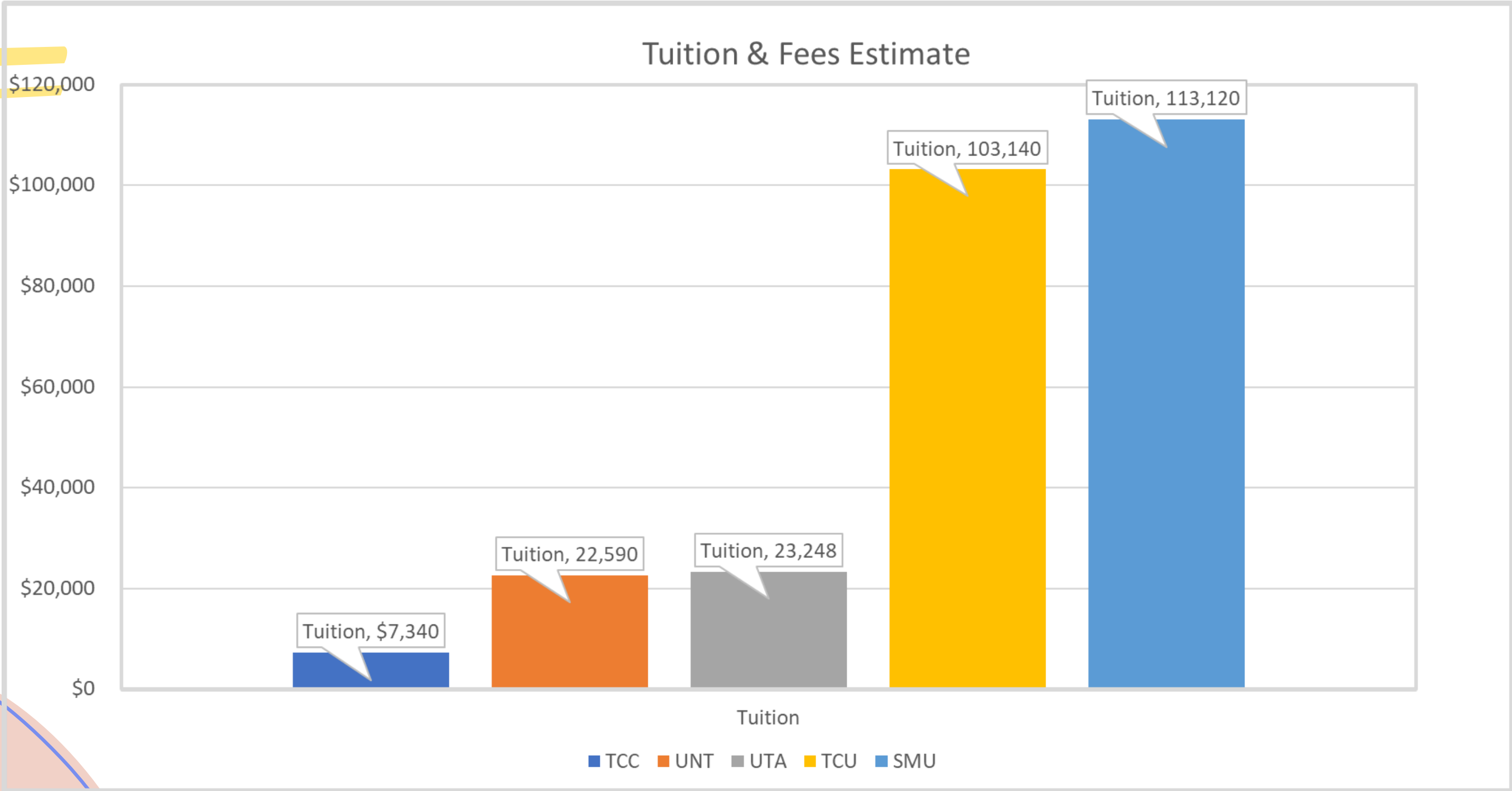
Many private universities may not accept dual enrollment but these courses are a gateway to being admitted into selective colleges.

April TBA: Admission Night - TCC Enrollment

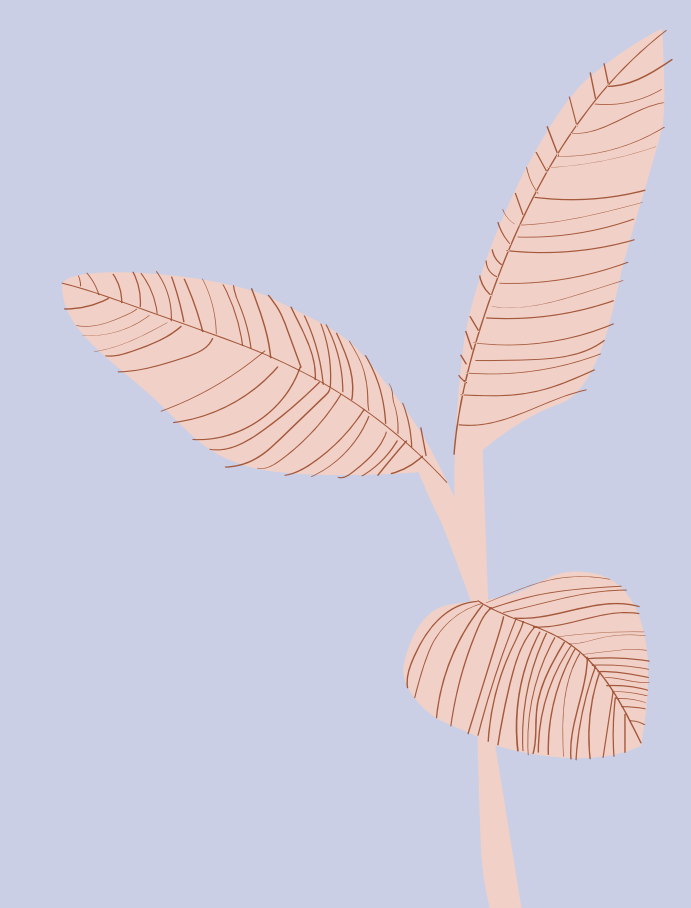
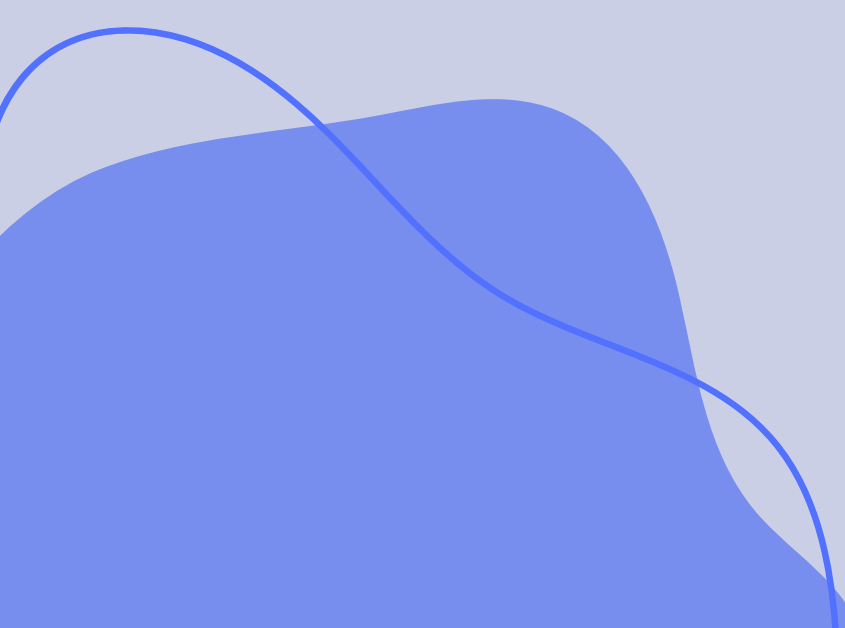
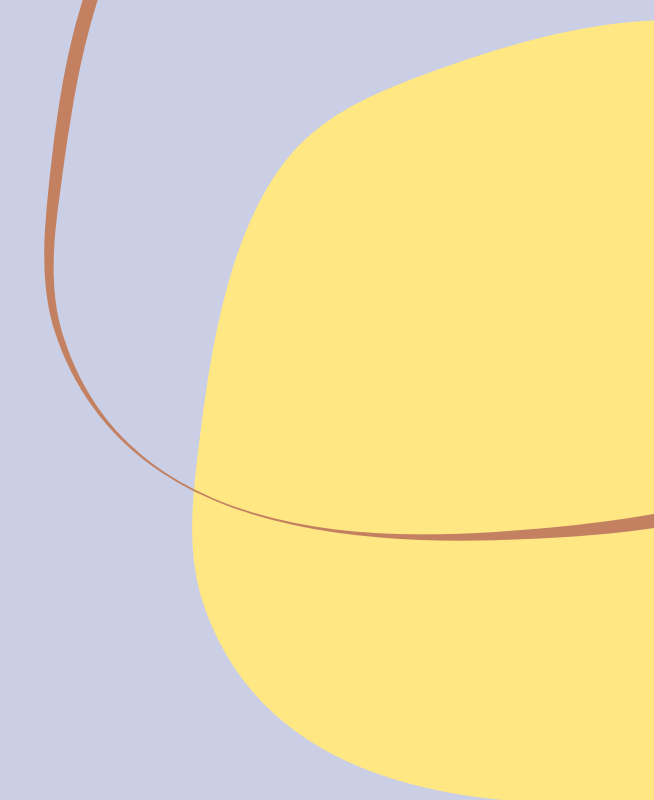
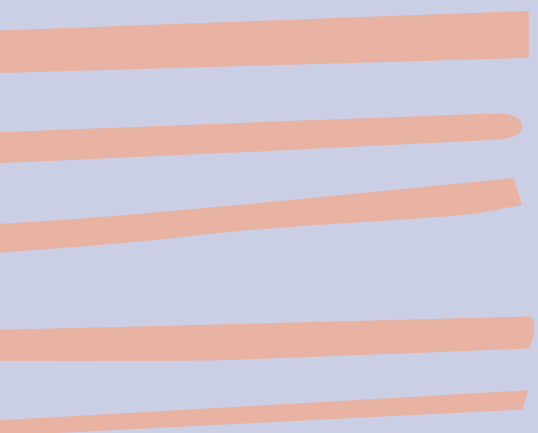
