- 6 period day, including 1 extended period for lunch
- Progress Report every 4.5 weeks
- Final grades posted at the conclusion of each semester
 - One Semester Course = 0.5 credit
 - Yearlong Course = 1.0 credit
- Grading Scale:

A (90-100)

B (80-89)

C (70-79)

 7 bonus points are added to passing final grades in Honors, AP and Dual Enrollment courses

Graduation Requirements



23 credits required

- English 4 credits
- Math 4 credits
- Science 4 credits
- Social Studies 3 credits
- CTAE/World Language/Fine Arts* 3 credits
 - * NOTE: For most colleges, 2 years or more of consecutive World Language credits in the SAME language is required for college admission
- Health/Personal Fitness 1 credit (each .5)
- Electives 4 credits

MS High School Credits



What happens when I accept high school credit in 8th grade?

- Start of student's high school GPA
- Grades/credit awarded are final and cannot be removed from transcript later
- Credit awarded does not count towards HOPE GPA
- Cannot repeat courses received credit for Ex: earned credit for 9th Literature = placement in 10th Literature

Acceleration and HS Impact



What benefits can acceleration provide at the high school level?

- More options such as Dual Enrollment or AP classes
- Additional opportunities to take elective courses for exploratory purposes
- Stronger academic resume for college purposes

Acceleration and HS Impact



Potential Implications to Consider:

- Cannot repeat classes where student earned credit already
- Off track from peers in academic courses. Ex: 9th graders in 10th Literature Honors
- Maxing out available high school courses. DE is available option but consider transportation, FERPA laws, classmates of various ages, complete college experience
- Required to take full schedule every year cannot leave early without administrative approval
- Look at the schedule in totality and consider student wellbeing and balance

Acceleration and HS Impact



Tips to help decide on accelerating:

- What is the student's plan? What math are you trying to get to by 12th grade?
- Student maturity is crucial. You know your child best.
- Try not to compare to neighbors and friends every student and their appropriate path is different.
- Know what your child is able to handle academically and emotionally. Look at the schedule in totality – add up outside commitments, average HW minutes per class, how much sleep your child needs, etc.
- Balance is a mental health necessity.

Credit Recovery Options



What happens when a student fails a class?

- Learning Lab Fulton Credit Recovery free during the school day
- Fulton Virtual \$chool cost is \$225 outside of school day, \$180 for free/reduced lunch students
- Georgia Virtual \$chool cost is \$250 outside of school day, \$180 for free/reduced lunch students


