



Upcoming Student Survey

Dear Families,

We thank you and your family for being our valued partners as we work together to educate our students at Kyrene de la Mariposa. As you may already be aware, building our social-emotional learning skills is an important goal of ours. At the beginning of the school year, we asked for your permission to have students participate in a social emotional learning survey. If we have consent for a student to participate, they will complete a survey designed to provide school staff data on students' understanding of concepts related to Harmony, which is the social-emotional learning curriculum we are implementing with our students.

The survey content will ask students to self-reflect on Emotion Regulation, Self-Efficacy, Sense of Belonging, and Teacher-Student Relationships. These topics are related to the content in Sanford Harmony and will help guide the implementation of the curriculum and measure its impact over time. The online survey will take place on January 29th, with make ups completed through February 4th. It will be completed at school and should not take more than 20-30 minutes to complete.

Student responses will provide invaluable insights into their experiences and how we can improve and adapt our school to their needs. If a student does not feel like they have enough information to answer a question, they will be able to skip the item altogether. The responses to these surveys will be completely confidential. Fourth Grade Experiments with Dash & Dot Robots!

During a recent poetry lesson in ELA, Mariposa fourth graders were able to experiment with transforming themselves into robots. The lesson target included using the App Wonder Workshop to code their Dash and Dot Robot to walk on a stage, read a poem of their creation aloud, and then exit the stage successfully. One of our awesome ISTE standards, Knowledge Constructor, indicates that students should strive to use a variety of resources and digital tools to produce creative artifacts and make meaningful learning experiences. This project was a great way for students to show their understanding of what it means to be a knowledge constructor!

Understanding Your Student's i-Ready Diagnostic Results



What is the Diagnostic?

The Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions for each student. As a student answers correctly, the questions get more difficult. As a student answers incorrectly, the questions get easier. This adaptability allows the Diagnostic to identify the strengths and opportunities for growth of each student.

Why is my student taking it?


The purpose of the Diagnostic is not to give your student a grade, but instead to determine how best to support their learning. It will help your student's teacher(s) determine their needs, personalize their learning, and monitor progress throughout the year.

How should I interpret my student's results?

How is my student doing overall?

The goal is for your student to be performing at or above grade level, which means they have mastered the skills students at that grade level are expected to master and are prepared to learn more advanced skills.

On the For Families report, the (a) blue bar(s) on the graph and the corresponding (3) placement level(s) indicate how your student performed on each test in relation to their grade level, which is indicated by the (a) green shading. The (b) National Norm percentile below the graph indicates how your student performed in relation to students in the same grade level nationwide.



How is my student doing in specific learning areas?

Students have different areas of strengths and opportunities for growth. It is important to understand how your student did in more specific learning areas, which are called <u>domains</u>. The **3 domain table** shows how your student did in specific domains and helps teachers know where to build on strengths and focus their support.

How is my student progressing over time?


The goal is also for your student to be making progress in their learning. After your student has taken more than one Diagnostic in the school year, you will see results for each Diagnostic, allowing you to see the progress your student is making both overall and in each domain.

Family Guide to Home Connect Letters for DIBELS

Home Connect Letters describe the tests used to determine your child's reading proficiency and what you can do to help your child develop these skills. In Kyrene, we use DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) to assess foundational reading skills of all children in kindergarten through 3rd grade.


Overview

The overview section contains information about your child's overall (or composite) reading score and a brief explanation of the meaning of the results.



Skills Review

The skills review section describes the reading skills that were measured and examples for each. Each skill is displayed with a progress bar with the benchmark goal starting at the green band. If your child is close to or above the goal, the less support he/she may need.



Activities

The activities section contains a list of recommended activities you can use to help advance your child's reading development. The Home Connect site at https://mclass.amplify.com/homeconnect/ provides even more activities.

Attention 5th Grade Families

Dear 5th Grade families,

This week your child will be bringing home information about the 2025-2026 middle school course selection process. Each 5th grader received an elective course selection form for their assigned school. Additional copies can be accessed on the Kyrene website on the Resources for Families and Community Page.

Parents/Guardians are requested to review this information with your child and sign the form, acknowledging your approval of the courses selected. Students are required to return the form to their teacher by January 15. During the week of January 23, our students are scheduled to use these forms to enter their preferences online with their classroom teacher.

Families who are considering a different middle school **must apply** for registration at that school through the online portal when next year's registration window opens on January 14, 2025. While students may select a different middle school's course selection form, they are not guaranteed placement at that school. Families must apply and be approved

for open enrollment to attend a non-resident school.


