


- Academic Expectations: Students must have earned a 2.0 fall semester to buy a ticket.

that feel more comfortable raising their hand for support in this way, as well as for parents who are seeing needs from their child at home that aren't necessarily showing at school.

Daybreak Health also has several pre-recorded classes for parents. These hour long recordings are informative and easy to understand. Topics include:

Daybreak's January webinar, *Exercise and Teen Emotional Wellbeing*, will take place **Wed**, **Jan 15** (**English**) **and Thu**, **Jan 16** (**Spanish**). It is important to provide young people opportunities and encouragement to participate in physical activities that are appropriate for their age, that are enjoyable, and that offer variety. This virtual class will help parents learn the relationships between mental health and exercise, body image concerns, and how to talk about and encourage a healthy relationship with exercise from a licensed clinician. It is important for parents/guardian to excuse their students' full day absences. Please contact the attendance office within 72 hours to get them excused. **Individual** period absences need to be cleared between the **student** and their **teacher**.

College Connection is an awesome program which allows students to get a jumpstart on and/or explore college. OUHSD students accepted into the CC program complete their senior year at Butte College, earning 18-30 college credits while fulfilling their graduation requirements. In order to apply for the program students need to be juniors who are on track to graduate with a 2.0 GPA.

Students accepted into the program are still OHS or LPHS students who graduate with their class and remain eligible for all HS activities: dances, homecoming events, band, sports, clubs, academic decathlon, mock trial, FCCLA etc...

January 9, 2025 FAFSA Workshop

Open to all Seniors. This workshop will occur during periods 1 – 6 in all Govt/Econ classes. Seniors will open their chrome books and complete their FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid.) The FAFSA is usually the greatest source for financial aid for going to any college, trade school or institution of higher education or training. Staff members will be present to help answer questions as they arise.
