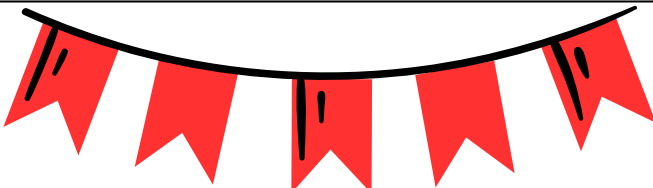

## INDIANA CORE40

Effective beginning with students who enter high school in 2012-13 school year (class of 2016).

### Course and Credit Requirements

<b>English/ Language Arts</b>	<b>8 credits</b> Including a balance of literature, composition and speech.
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>6 credits (in grades 9-12)</b> 2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <small>Or complete Integrated Math I, II, and III for 6 credits. Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school.</small>
<b>Science</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: Biology I 2 credits: Chemistry I or Physics I or Integrated Chemistry-Physics 2 credits: any Core 40 science course
<b>Social Studies</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: U.S. History 1 credit: U.S. Government 1 credit: Economics 2 credits: World History/Civilization or Geography/History of the World
<b>Directed Electives</b>	<b>5 credits</b> World Languages Fine Arts Career and Technical Education
<b>Physical Education</b>	<b>2 credits</b>
<b>Health and Wellness</b>	<b>1 credit</b>
<b>Electives*</b>	<b>6 credits</b> <small>(College and Career Pathway courses recommended)</small>

**40 Total State Credits Required**

### CORE40 with Academic Honors (minimum 47 credits)

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits (6 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following:
  - A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
  - B. Earn 6 verifiable transcribed college credits in dual credit courses from the approved dual credit list.
  - C. Earn two of the following:
    1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcribed college credits from the approved dual credit list,
    2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams,
    3. 2 credits in IB standard level courses and corresponding IB exams.
  - D. Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
  - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section
  - F. Earn 4 credits in IB courses and take corresponding IB exams.

### CORE40 with Technical Honors (minimum 47 credits)

For the Core 40 with Technical Honors diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
  1. State approved, industry recognized certification or credential, or
  2. Pathway dual credits from the approved dual credit list resulting in 6 transcribed college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following,
  - A. Any one of the options (A - F) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors
  - B. Earn the following scores or higher on WorkKeys; Reading for Information - Level 6, Applied Mathematics - Level 6, and Locating Information-Level 5.
  - C. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Accuplacer: Writing 80, Reading 90, Math 75.
  - D. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Compass; Algebra 66 Writing 70, Reading 80.

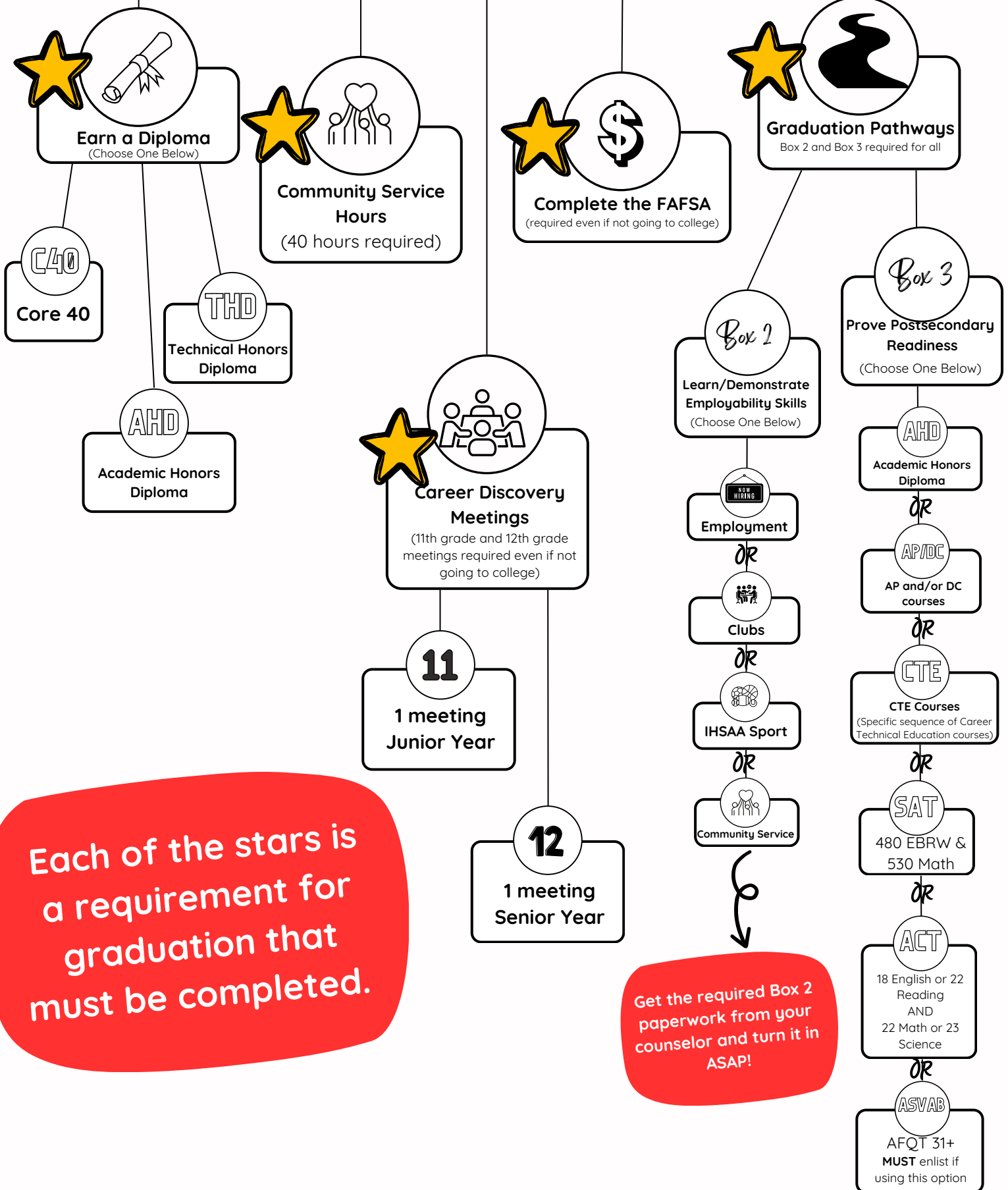
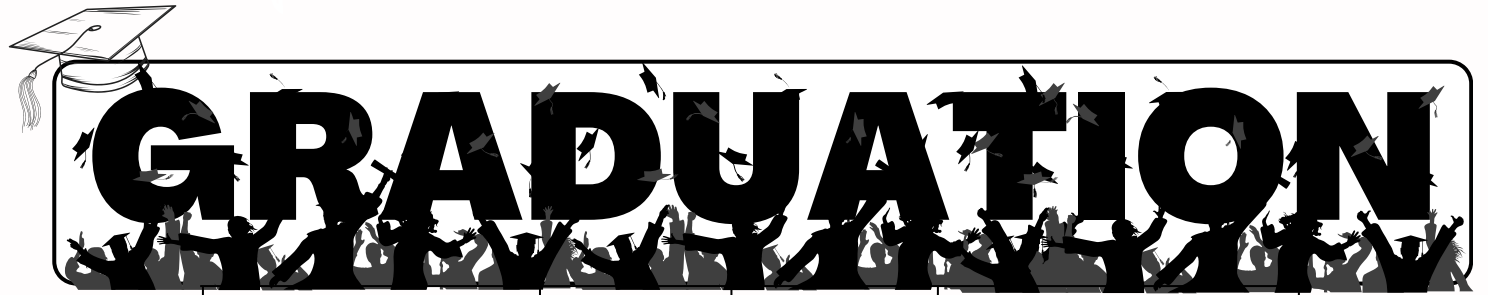

# Graduation Pathways Box 3 Options



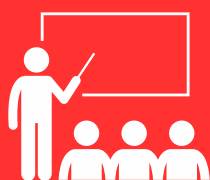
## Academic Honors Diploma

Students need to meet all requirements for Academic Honors Diploma to utilize this pathway. Students are encouraged to have a backup plan just in case.



## Dual credit and/or AP courses

Students who choose this option would need to earn a “C” average in at least 3 courses, one of which must be a Core course. For the purposes of pathway completion, students do not need to sign up for the dual credit (though they DO need to be ELIGIBLE to receive the credit based on their GPA. Students would also need to take the AP Exam in May.



## CTE (Career Technical Education) Concentrator Courses

A CTE Concentrator is a specific sequence of courses that create a pathway. Each pathway consists of 3 year-long courses in which students must earn a “C” average in order to utilize. Typically more “hands on” courses.

The below options for pathways are all standardized test options. Students would need to earn a minimum score to utilize any of these as a pathway



**SAT**

## SAT

Students would need to earn a 480 in EBRW, 530 in Math, minimum. Students can utilize a Saturday administration score, or the score they earn during a school day testing. Students would need to make sure their counselor has a copy of their test scores from College Board.



**ACT**

## ACT

Students would need to earn an 18 in English or 22 in Reading AND a 22 in Math or 23 in Science to utilize this pathway. Students would need to make sure their counselor has a copy of their test score




## ASVAB

Students who wish to use the ASVAB AFQT score MUST enlist in the military in order to graduate. There is paperwork to fill out should students wish to utilize this pathway. The minimum AFQT score is 31.

## NAVIANCE

## COLLEGE REP VISITS

- College representatives come to CPHS to meet with interested students
- You can ask the rep questions and learn about schools, requirements to get in and their majors--To meet with them, sign up in Naviance under "What's new"
- Don't forget: CPHS hosts the College and Career Fair in September!
- **Beginning in the 24/25 school year, every student must meet with a college or career representative once per year for a minimum of 30 minutes as a graduation requirement.**

## SAT

- In the spring, the SAT will be given at CPHS to all juniors during the school day
- If you want to take the SAT in addition to the School Choice test date, you will need to register, choose a location, choose a test date and pay at [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)
- You can send scores to up to 4 colleges for free if the request is made during registration or prior to the test date. SAT charges a fee to send scores to colleges AFTER the test date

## ACT

- If you would like to take the ACT, you'll need to register, choose a location, choose a date and pay at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org).
- You can send scores to up to 4 colleges for free if the request is made during registration or prior to the test date. ACT charges a fee to send scores to colleges AFTER the test date.

## TRANSCRIPT

- At the beginning of your senior year, your transcripts will be sent to any colleges that you add to "Colleges I'm Applying To" in Naviance
- Colleges will see your grades from 9th grade, 10th grade and 11th grade, and will ask your counselor for a list of the courses you're taking in 12th grade
- Remember, JUNIOR grades are the most recent grades that colleges will see!
