INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

The Diploma Programme (DP) is designed for students in their junior and senior years of high school.

The DP focuses on a global cultural education, encouraging the development of skills for long term success.

The DP works to cultivate emotional, ethical and physical development in addition to academic rigor.

DP students study six areas of knowledge along with 3 core components.



HOW DOES MY CHILD DO IB?

Attend Interlake

- All Interlake students are eligible for the IB Diploma Program. (Myth of AL only)

Plan ahead

- Students must be in Algebra 2 or higher in 10th grade
- Start a world language by 10th grade

IB Course Registration

- Takes place Spring of 10th grade

WHAT ARE THE AIMS OF IB?

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IB STUDENTS ARE...

Why IB?

Open-minded.

- Students understand and appreciate their own cultures and personal histories, and are open to the perspectives, values and traditions of other individuals and communities. They are accustomed to seeking and evaluating a range of points of view and are willing to grow from the experience.

Knowledgeable.

- Students acquire in-depth knowledge and develop understanding across a broad and balanced range of disciplines. Students are assessed in manners true to each discipline (written exams, oral exams, portfolios, lab work, projects, essays etc.)

Inquirers.

- Students acquire the skills necessary to conduct inquiry and research and show independence in learning.

IB STUDENTS ARE...

Why IB?


Communicators.

- Students understand and express ideas and information confidently and creatively in more than one language and in a variety of modes of communication.

Risk-takers.

- Students approach unfamiliar situations and uncertainty with courage and forethought and have the independence of spirit to explore new roles, ideas and strategies.

Reflective.

- Students give thoughtful consideration to their own learning and experience. They are able to assess and understand their strengths and limitations in order to support their learning and personal development.
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IB STUDENTS ARE...

Why IB?


Balanced.

- Students understand the importance of balancing different aspects of our lives – intellectual, physical, emotional.

Principled.

- Students act with integrity and honesty, and take responsibility for their actions and their consequences.

Caring.

- Students show empathy, compassion, and respect and work to make a difference in others and the world.

Assessment

AP

Scored on a 1-5 scale.

Final score is based on single-day exam in May (except Art).

Exams are in 2 parts; multiple choice and short answer.

All parts of the exams are compulsory.

IB

Scored on a 1-7 scale.

Final score is based on multiple assessments over 1-2 years, including May exams.

Only science exams have multiple choice.

Exam parts are split over multiple days.

Almost every exam has choice of what questions to answer.



WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF IB?

Programs

AP

AP classes may be taught by any teacher at any school.

The AP Audit requires individual teachers to submit their course syllabi to ensure that the AP in the class title is being met.

IB

A school must be authorized to offer the IB Diploma (a 2-year process).

IB Diploma Coordinators are responsible for the implementation of the program at each school. The program is evaluated every 5 years.

Diploma Coordinators must manage all of the activities related to the Diploma Program as set by IBO.

College Credit

AP

AP courses were developed with college credit in mind.

“Most four-year colleges and universities in the United States—as well as many institutions in more than 100 other countries—grant students credit, placement, or both for qualifying AP Exam scores.” ⁽¹⁾

Credit policies across colleges are fairly similar.

IB

IB courses were not developed with college credit in mind.

IB focuses on “recognition” in admissions and not necessarily college credit.

Colleges award general IB credit and credit to replace specific classes.

Credit policies across colleges are very different.

BIOL 161 Advanced Placement (AP) in General Biology 1 (5-) NSc

Course awarded based on Advanced Placement (AP) score. Consult the Admissions Exams for Credit website for more information. Credit/no-credit only.

BIOL 162 Advanced Placement (AP) in General Biology 2 (-5) NSc

Course awarded based on Advanced Placement (AP) score. Consult the Admissions Exams for Credit website for more information. Credit/no-credit only.

BIOL 180 Introductory Biology (5) NSc

Mendelian genetics, evolution, biodiversity of life forms, ecology, and conservation biology. Open to all students interested in biology whether intending to major in the biological sciences, enroll in preprofessional programs, or fulfill a Natural World requirement. First course in a three-quarter series (BIOL 180, BIOL 200, BIOL 220). Maximum 15 credits allowed between BIOL 180; BIOL 200; BIOL 220 (or equivalents); and BIOL 240. Course equivalent to: B BIO 180. Course overlaps with: T BIOL 120. Offered: AWSpS.

WHY IB?

THE DP CURRICULUM PREPARES STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE



A 2009 study looked at the standards for seven Diploma Programme courses and compared them to a set of standards for college-readiness.

Researchers found:

a high degree of alignment with college readiness standards in all subject areas

many individual IB standards were more advanced than those required for success in entry-level college courses

IB standards address key cognitive strategies (critical thinking, intellectual inquisitiveness and interpretation skills) that have been identified by college instructors as necessary for college success.

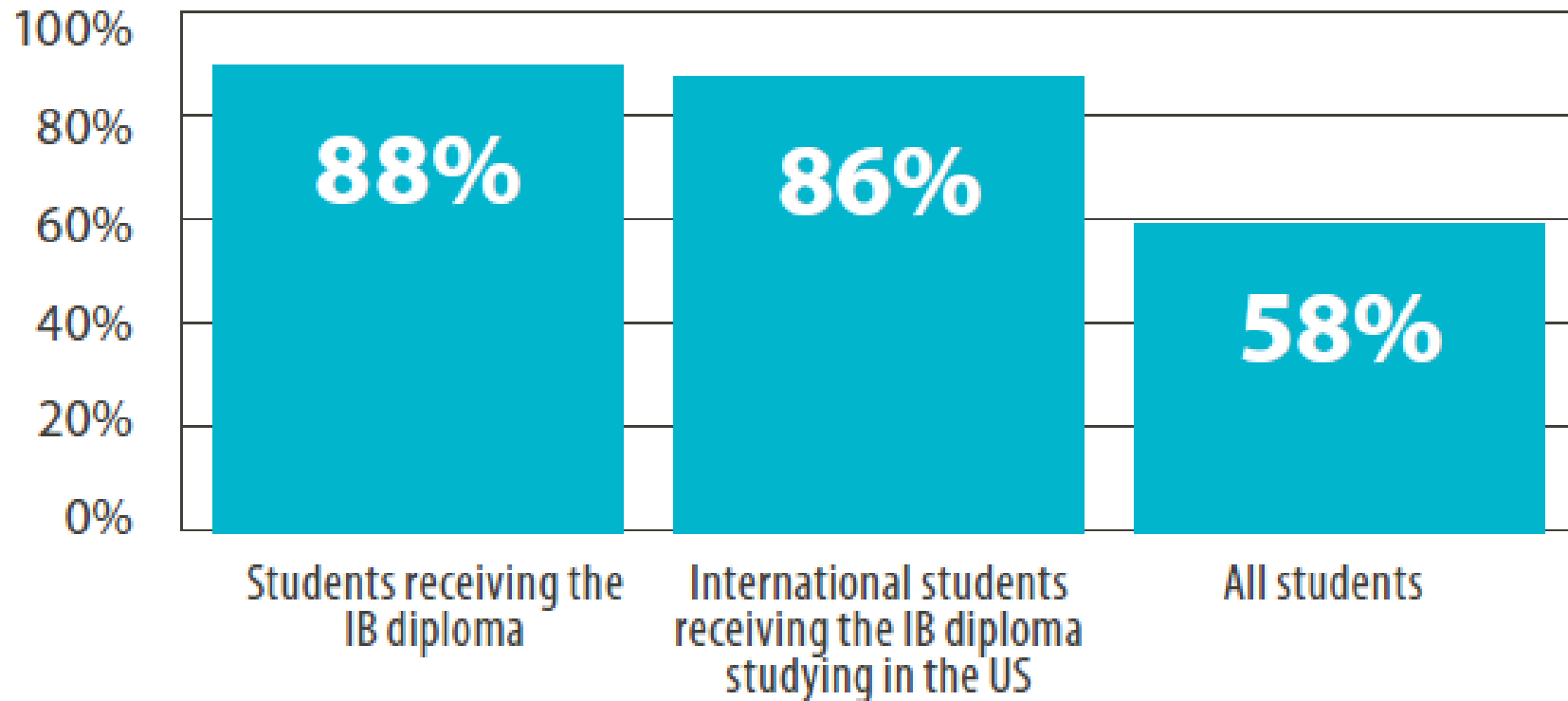

Diploma Programme

The **average acceptance rate of IB students** into university/college is **22% higher** than the average acceptance rate of the total population.

The acceptance rate of IB students into **Ivy League** institutions (Princeton, Yale, Brown, Harvard, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth, University of Pennsylvania) is **between 3% and 13% higher** compared to the total population acceptance rate.

Core requirements

- Theory of Knowledge course

IB CORE



Theory of Knowledge: capstone IB course

- How do you know what you claim to know?
- Two semesters spanning 1st and 2nd years

Extended Essay: required of all Diploma candidates

- 4,000 word essay on any topic a student chooses within IB subjects
- Each student receives up to 5 hours of help from an Interlake teacher

CAS: creativity, activity and service. Sustained, intentional participation and reflection

- Endeavors outside of school that spark creative action or thinking, body movement, and direct community service to others.

2025 TOK ESSAY TOPICS

1. Do historians and human scientists have an ethical obligation to follow the directive: “do not ignore contradictory evidence”?
2. Do the ever-improving tools of an area of knowledge always result in improved knowledge?
3. Does acquiring knowledge destroy our sense of wonder?
