## START PLANNING

- Create an email address you will use for colleges and communication.
- □ Plan to visit at least 4-6 college campuses this school year.
- Create your PSAT, ACT, and/or SAT testing timeline.
- □ Focus on grades and maintain rigor in courses Grades matter!
- Document everything you are involved in: clubs, sports, volunteering, and work. Consider leadership roles, summer programs, or opportunities to help you explore your interests.
- Explore and learn about various colleges attend fairs and high school visits.

## ACT and SAT TESTING

- Prepare for and take the **PSAT/NMSQT in October**.
- □ Your PSAT score will help you determine if the SAT or ACT is a better-fit test. You may qualify for the <u>NMSQT scholarship</u>.
- Create your Khan Academy account and practice online at <u>www.khanacademy.org</u>
- Register for SAT <u>www.collegeboard.org</u>
  Register for ACT <u>www.act.org</u>
- All colleges take both test scores. Some colleges are test optional https://fairtest.org/

### NCAA/MILITARY

- □ If you are considering participating in Division I or II athletics, be sure to review <u>NCAA requirements</u> and register with NCAA <u>https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/</u>
