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### HAPPY BIRTHDAY DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. !

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was a civil rights leader who believed in making the world a better place for everyone. He worked hard to bring people of all colors and backgrounds together and taught us the importance of treating each other fairly and kindly. Dr. King believed in solving problems peacefully, not through fighting or hurting others. One of his most famous achievements was his role in the Civil Rights Movement, where he worked to end unfair laws that kept people of different races apart and unequal. His dream was for all people to be treated equally, no matter the color of their skin. He gave one of his most famous speeches, called the "I Have a Dream" speech at the March on Washington, where he shared his hope for a world full of love, justice, and fairness.

Dr. King's birthday is on January 15, but every year we celebrate it on the third Monday in January. This day is called Martin Luther King Jr. Day. It is a special holiday for all Americans because it reminds us of his message of kindness, equality, and working together. People celebrate this day by doing good things for their communities, learning about his life, and remembering how important it is to stand up for what is right.

By celebrating Dr. King's birthday, we honor his dream and continue to work toward making the world a better, fairer place for everyone.
