- Steamboat Springs is surrounded by two ski areas, three Colorado State Parks, and more than 150 natural springs, lakes, rivers, and trail systems

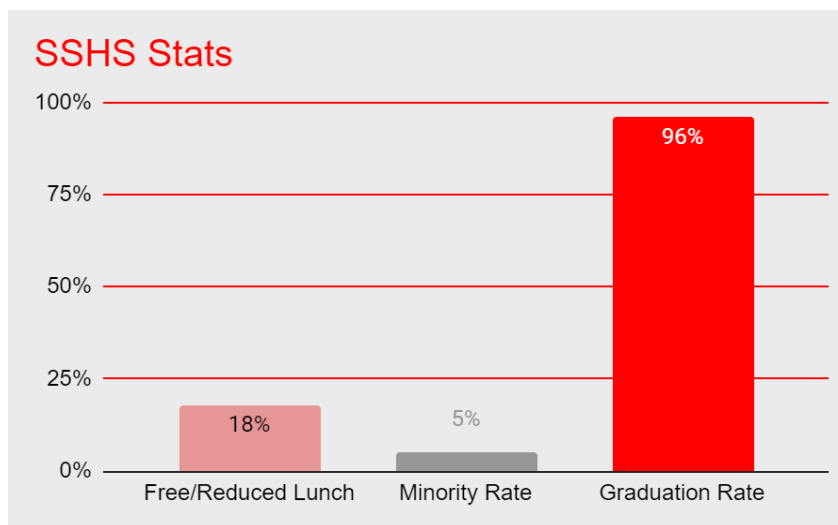
