WHAT ARE VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS?



- A **vocational school** will offer you training and courses to prepare you to enter the workforce as quickly as possible.
- Vocational schools focus on hands-on application of skills needed to do a job.
- You may earn a diploma or a certificate, prepare for a licensing exam, or study to begin work in a skilled trade.
- These schools typically offer programs that are two years or less.
- Provide you with formal classes and hands-on experience related to your future career interests.

WHAT ARE 2-YEAR COLLEGES?



Olympic College - OC



Tacoma Community College - TCC

- Community colleges are 2-year institutions
- You can earn an associate degrees.
- An associate degree is designed to be completed in two years and can prepare you to transfer to a 4-year institution.
- Many of them offer certificate programs.
- Two-year institutions generally cost much less than other higher education systems.
- There are more than 40 community colleges in Washington.

WHAT ARE 4 -YEAR COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES?





- A college or university where you can earn a bachelor's degree.
- Universities are usually larger than colleges and may have larger classes than colleges.
- Both types of 4-year schools usually offer a 4-year bachelor's degree
- Types of 4-Year Institutions
- Public: Receives public money to ensure that they are affordable.
- Washington colleges or universities will be less expensive than an out of state school.
- They also vary in size, with the majority being middle or large schools with over 5,000 students.
- **Private:** Colleges and universities that are mostly funded through non-government sources.

4-YEAR COLLEGE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS ... (CADRs)

- English 4 years
- Math 3 years (Algebra, Geometry, Ad. Algebra) recommended one level beyond Ad. Algebra
- Senior year math-based quantitative course 1 credit math or math-based science
- Science 3 years (2 lab) (1 must be bio/chem/physics and 1 must be algebra-based)
- At least two years of the **same** World Language
- Social Studies 3 years
- **Art** − 1 year
- ** WAGAP program 3.0 GPA or higher, guarantee admissions to all *but U of W- Seattle and Bothell*



WHAT ARE SELECTIVE 4-YEAR COLLEGES

LOOKING FOR?

More intensive requirements





- Stronger GPA
- Stronger ACT/SAT scores **some test optional
- Rigor of courses taken (average 6+ AP, CiHS, mostly honors)
- At least two or more years of same Foreign Language
- Math through at least Pre-Calculus
- How did you get involved in your community?
 - Did you get involved in high school, and did you demonstrate leadership in any of these activities?
- Essays to show writing skill & character of applicant
- Letters of Recommendations from counselor & teachers

NCAA Eligibility – want to play a sport at a Div. I or II college?

- You should register with the NCAA Eligibility Center (<u>www.ncaa.org/student-</u> <u>athletes/future/how-register</u>) at the <u>end of</u> <u>your junior year.</u>
- The registration fee is \$100.00.
- NCAA will ONLY accept online registration.
- You will need to send an initial and a final transcript to NCAA.
