January

Teachers input recommendations on Genesis (Jan. 21-Jan. 31)

Teacher-student communication

Review Program of Studies for course descriptions and graduation requirements

February

Counselors will send out emails inviting students to sign up for a course selection meeting

Students/Parents review recommendations in Genesis (After 1/31 12PM)

Meetings are between student and counselor only

March

If eligible, a student can appeal two classes (due 3/6)

Student will be notified by content supervisor (decision emailed by 3/26)

Parent can override an appeal denial for one class

Overrides must be completed by 3PM on April 4

*Mathematics-15 credits including Algebra 1 and Geometry or the content equivalent and a third year that builds on the concepts and skills of algebra and geometry and prepares students for college and 21st Century careers.

**Science-15 credits including laboratory biology; chemistry, environmental science or physics; and an additional lab/inquiry-based science.

***World Language - 10 credits is the requirement, it is recommended to take three or four years of WL
