*As a University of Tennessee Flagship School, Fulton High School graduates enrolling as first-time, first-year students at UT are eligible to receive the Flagship Scholarship. Combined with the HOPE Scholarship, it covers tuition and mandatory fees for up to eight semesters, equivalent to nearly \$52,000 over four years.*

Fulton boasts one of the few AP Capstone Programs in a urban Title 1 school. The program develops students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting. The program celebrates a 100% pass rate and has produced graduates who have gone on to enroll at John Hopkins and into the University of Tennessee's Haslam Scholars Program.

## ACADEMICS

Fulton High School gives students the opportunity to earn college credit by offering a number of Advanced Placement (AP), Statewide Dual Credit (SDC), and Dual Enrollment (DE) classes.

AP and SDC classes are high school courses that follow a rigorous college-level curriculum for which students can earn high school credit; they may also earn college credits with a qualifying score on an optional final exam.

DE classes are college courses for which a high school student is enrolled simultaneously at a postsecondary institution. Successful completion of the course results in both high school and college credits.
