New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) Student Checklist



What is the New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB)?

The New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages, in addition to English. The NYSSB intends to affirm the value of diversity in a multilingual society, encourage the study of languages, identify high school graduates with language and biliteracy skills for employers, provide universities with additional information about applicants seeking admission, prepare students with twenty-first-century skills, and to recognize the value of world and home language instruction in schools.

How will the student receive the accreditation?

The NYSSB will be awarded by the Commissioner to students who meet the criteria established by the Board of Regents. The NYSSB seal will be affixed to the high school diploma and/or language included on the student transcript of graduating students attaining the NYSSB criteria. Some students may be awarded the NYSSB after graduation due to test result data release dates. In this case, during the graduation ceremony, these students will be recognized as "candidates for the New York State Seal of Biliteracy".

- Submit an application from CCSD Homepage > Schools > CHS > Academics > Seal of Biliteracy_>

- Once your application has been reviewed, you will be added to the NYS Seal of Biliteracy Schoology Course.
 - o This course will be used to communicate reminders and updates to NYSSB applicants.
 - Those who have not taken AP Literature or AP Language will submit the English Portfolio requirements to the Schoology course. See the next page for more information.
- Work with your NYSSB advisor to fulfill all NYSSB criteria by Friday, May 23rd, 2025.
- Students with a culminating project or portfolio will participate in a Panel Presentation.
 - O Students will sign up for World Language presentations in class.
 - Students who need to participate in an English presentation will be reached out to via Schoology to sign up for a time slot.
