USE YOUR TEACHERS: A good habit in preparation for these exams is to take advantage of opportunities provided to you by your teachers. Many teachers provide review packets that cover everything you have learned from September until now that is needed to be known for the tests. Also, attend some of the extra help opportunities your teachers offer.
