- c. Send home progress reports and report cards
- 1. Acadian will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified in the area which he/she teaches by:
 - a. Provide parents with rights to know letters
- 1. Acadian will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph –

ï the state's academic content standards,

ï the state's student academic achievement standards.

ï the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,

ï the requirements of Part A,

ï how to monitor their child's progress, and

ï how to work with educators:

(List activities, such as workshops, conferences, classes, both in-state and out-of-state, including any equipment or other materials that may be necessary to ensure success.)

- a. Leap ELA and Math
- b. Leap Science and Social Studies
- c. After School Tutoring
- d. Pull out tutoring during the day
- 1. Acadian will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
 - a. Make and Take workshops added to each parent night
 - b. Supplemental resources/homework help books will be sent home with each child
 - c. Unit Introduction letters embedded in curriculum will be sent home at the beginning of each unit
- 1. Acadian will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
