


Your Journey to May 2029







MSHSAA Eligibility Requirements

Applies to students competing in sports, cheer, pommies, band, choir, and orchestra programs.

Students must be enrolled in 3.0 units of credit (6 classes) during season of sport/activity and the semester prior to the sport/activity (except for 1st semester 9th graders).
