PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The College Credit Plus program allows students to earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking courses from Ohio colleges or universities. CCP enhances students' college readiness and postsecondary success, while providing a variety of course options to the college-ready student.

BY PARTICIPATING IN THE CCP PROGRAM, STUDENTS CAN:

- Elect to take courses on the AU main campus, online, or at select partnering high schools.
- Explore career paths and help them decide on a major. Taking diverse classes can help uncover interests.
- Work toward multiple majors or minors while finishing college in the usual time frame.
- Seek courses not offered at their high school to meet graduation requirements.
- Enroll in AU courses and attend events to learn more about Ashland University.
- Access campus resources, such as AU's library, tutoring services, computer labs, the Writing and Communication Center, the rec center, and participate in campus clubs and events.
- Take a class to explore expectations and boost their confidence if they are uncertain if their plans after high school include college.

WE OFFER A \$4,000 SCHOLARSHIP TO ALL AU CCP STUDENTS!

- All high school students (in the Class of 2024 and beyond) who are enrolled in the College Credit Plus program at AU and matriculate directly from high school into a bachelor's program will receive a yearly \$1,000 scholarship (\$500 to be awarded in the fall semester and \$500 in the spring semester). This scholarship is renewable yearly (for up to four years, or \$4,000), and is stackable upon other scholarships/aid.
- An additional scholarship of up to \$1,000 is available for students completing the CCP Business Academy pathway. (See additional information later in this brochure.)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY

- Students must meet the state's program eligibility requirements, as well as the admission requirements of the college.

- Home and private school students must apply for funding through ODEW. It is not necessary for all students to take the Accuplacer to participate in CCP at AU. You only need to take the Accuplacer if -

Your HS GPA is between 2.50 and 2.99, and you do not have qualifying ACT or SAT scores.

You wish to take a course with special placement score requirements (such as math) and do not have ACT or SAT scores.

You are not in 10th grade or older. Transcripts must reflect final grades for the student's 9th grade year. (If you are in 9th grade or younger, please visit the <u>ashland.edu/testing-center</u> and schedule a time to take the Reading section for program admission, other sections are required for course placements.)

AU accepts Accuplacer scores from other colleges, but we only use the Reading, Writing and QAS (math) sections. AU does not accept the WritePlacer or AAF sections.

The deadline to test for program admission or course placement is June 30th for fall semester and October 31 for spring semester.

COURSE SELECTION

Ashland University offers CCP courses that students can take on campus, online, or at select high schools. Your course choices will depend on whether you're exploring majors, meeting high school graduation requirements, or planning a degree at Ashland University.

LEVEL ONE COURSES

Ohio state law requires new students to choose from the college's Level One Course List until they complete 15 credit hours (about five classes). These Level One Courses are designed to support academic and career growth, prepare you for transfer credits, build specialized knowledge, or provide practical experience. You can find AU's Level One Courses at <u>ashland.edu/ccp-level-one</u>.



Many of our CCP students live a distance from Ashland University or may not yet have their driver's licenses, making online courses a highly convenient option. Nearly all AU online sections are asynchronous, meaning you won't have live, scheduled class sessions where you must be present at a specific time. There are no live lectures or real-time class discussions. You manage your own pace for completing readings, watching lectures, and finishing assignments.

POTENTIAL PATHWAYS

Ohio's CCP laws require high schools and colleges to establish 15- and 30-hour pathways for students. Their purpose is to guide students in their dual enrollment and academic planning. It is important to note that you are not required to complete a pathway during your participation in the CCP program. You may take as few or as many courses as you like, provided you stay within the yearly 30-credit hour limit (and 120 credit hours overall) during your course of participation in the program.

The pathways on the following page are JUST A FEW of the popular degree options available at AU. Each student's educational journey is unique, allowing for personalized pathways that fit within your daily schedule and program requirements. Your CCP advisor is here to help you create a customized pathway tailored to your goals.

- **15-HOUR PATHWAY:** Designed for students who want to take a modest amount of college coursework alongside their high school classes.
- **30-HOUR PATHWAY:** Intended for students who wish to pursue a more substantial amount of college coursework, often aiming to complete an entire academic year of college credits. To build a 30-hour pathway, start with the 15-hour pathway and add a 30-hour pathway in your area of interest.
- ASSOCIATE DEGREE PATHWAYS are also an option if you do not plan to pursue a bachelor's degree. Please contact your CCP advisor for more information.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

CAN I PARTICIPATE?

Students must be Ohio residents to participate. Authorized students in grades 7-12 who are enrolled in Ohio public schools, nonpublic high schools, or homeschooled may choose to participate in the CCP program at Ashland University. Unauthorized students include, but are not limited to, foreign students who are not part of an exchange program, out-of-state students and students coded as unauthorized through EMIS. Students must meet the state's eligibility requirements and the admission requirements of each college they apply to.

WHAT COURSES CAN I TAKE?

Until students complete 15 credit hours in coursework, they must choose from a list of Level One courses. Each college will have its own Level One list. See <u>ashland.edu/ccp-level-one</u> for AU's complete list of courses.

WHERE CAN I TAKE CLASSES?

Courses are available at the AU main campus, online, and "in-house" at partnering high schools.

AM I LIMITED TO THE CCP COURSES OFFERED AT MY HIGH SCHOOL?

No. If your high school does not offer CCP courses that interest you, you are not restricted to those courses. You may take courses from any combination of locations (at your high school, AU main campus or online) as long as they fit into your schedule, and you do not exceed the 30-hour per year limit.

*Talk to your High School about how the 30-hour formula is calculated.

ARE CCP CLASSES TRANSFERABLE?

It is important to understand that each institution has its own policies regarding credit transfer, and it is not possible for colleges to make a blanket statement on transferability until it is known which college you will be attending and what your major will be. Students are responsible for reviewing the transfer credit policies of the school they wish to attend before they enroll in a course. Nearly all the time, credits will transfer (sometimes as electives); however, a more important consideration is whether these credits will satisfy specific requirements for a particular program, depending on the major.

IS IT REALLY FREE? WHAT ABOUT TEXTBOOKS?

YES! There are no tuition charges for AU courses when they are part of the CCP program. AU waives all course and lab fees. The student/family is responsible for transportation if they choose to take a course on AU's main campus.

Public and private school students' textbooks are paid for by their school district. Most students who take courses on the main campus will get their books from the AU Campus Store; however, please check with your guidance counselor about your school's individual textbook policy. Home school students must purchase their own textbooks.
